FIRST WITNESS. §3155139 Lance Sergeant R. Archambault states:-

I am Platoon Sergeant of No.12 Platoon \*C\* Coy, 87th Battalion Canadian Infantry of which Pte. Aubut was a member.

FIRST WITNESS §3155139 L/Sgt R. Archambault (Contd)

On December 14th 1918, when I called the roll. Pte Aubut was absent, and I have not seen him since.

SECOND WITNESS. §41498 Pte. Jones, I. / (examined by Court)

Q. Were you the Sentry on duty on Dec. 16th at Courceilles Motte when the death of Pte Aubut occurred.

A. Yes.

Q. What were your instructions when put on duty?

A. I was instructed to protect Government property and stop any person from loitering around the Station, unless in possession of a pass and to halt them in day time and to fire at sight at night.

Q. Were these instructions given to you in writing or verbally?

A. Verbally by my Officer.

Q. Were you requested to repeat these instructions.

A. Yes.

Q. Relate to Court as briefly as possible how the shooting occurred.

A. I was on guard at Courceilles Motte Station at about 9.40 P.M. I saw four persons loitering about the Station which contained Government property. I halted these persons. On the second halt they shouted "It's alright, chum" I walked about ten yards up the line and turning around saw the four soldiers attempting to take Government property away, so I challenged them three times and received no answer. I then fired, according to my orders. I then sent the other sentry to the Sgt. in charge of the Guard, who came down and arrested the remaining three soldiers.

Q. Were you in charge of the Guard at Courceilles Motte Station on night of December 16/17th

A. No.



THIRD WITNESS, 202447 Sgt Dijks (Contd)

A. Yes.

Q. What instructions did you receive on taking over the Guard,

A. I took over on the 9th December, the orders were that each man in day time was to have five rounds of Ammunition in his magazine, and at night four in Magazine and one in the breech. If they saw at night any person on the Railway at this particular end of the beat they were to shoot on sight.

Q. Were these instructions given to you verbally or in writing.

A. Verbally.

Q. By whom were these instructions given.

A. I believe by a Canadian Officer of the Battalion we relieved.

Q. To whom were they given.

A. To the whole Guard in my Presence as well as the officer in charge of the guard.

Q. When did you hear of the shooting of Pte. Aubut.

A. On account of repeated looting it was necessary for sentries to be doubled at this point. One of these Sentries Pte. Smith reported to me at 9.45 P.M.

Q. What action did you take.

A. I endeavoured to locate whereabouts of the wounded man but was unable to do so until directed to a civilian house, where I found him in a dying condition. I at once sent for a Stretcher Bearer who dressed his wound and carried him back to the Station.

Q. Did you call a Doctor?

A. A civilian Doctor was called, who stayed until the man was dead.

Q. How long before a ~~Doctor~~ Doctor was called?

A. Immediately, and he arrived thirty minutes later.

Q. Are you satisfied your instructions to the Sentries were properly carried out.

A. Yes.



THIRD WITNESS, Sgt Dijks, (Contd)

A. Several nights previous to the 16th instant I have had continued reports from Nos 1 and 2 Sentries concerning material being moved during the time of patrolling this beat. This usually happened between 6 P.M. and 9 P.M. and 9 P.M. to midnight. I myself have watched the place where figures have been seen several nights till after midnight and had only just left the spot when, what turns out to be this soldier and three others appeared out of some adjoining gardens to try to remove a large piece of canvas. On the nights of December 14th and 15th Nos 1 and 2 reliefs both reported that they had challenged someone who disappeared and was not seen again. On the night of the 16th the sentry on No.1. beat reported at 8.15 p.m. that four people were coming towards the siding, but on seeing two sentries they went away again. I examined the siding again and found that a large roll of canvas had been moved and dragged up a bank and placed on rollers ready to be moved quickly, so I drew the attention of the next relief to this, also placing extra guards. On about 9.45 P.M. I heard two shots and had a report that someone was shot, so I went at once to the spot but could not find any trace of anyone. I examined the sentries and found two shots missing, one from each rifle. № 14793, Pte Jones reported that he heard someone approaching the siding as he was standing in between the waggons. On going out from the waggons he saw four figures against a piece of canvas. He challenged them three times. Two ran away but the others took no notice and stooped down against the roll of canvas, ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ when he fired. Both got away, but I found the wounded man in an adjoining house but he died shortly afterwards. № 65188 Pte Smith, N.2 Sentry, reported that he fired the second shot into the bank to frighten them. The following morning, Dec. 17th I assisted Lt. Garbitt in arresting the remainder of these troops, as they had already made it public news that they were deserters from the 87th Canadian Infantry Battalion.

FOURTH WITNESS. 3155157 Pte Belanger, J. 87th Bn. Canadian Infantry. (Questioned by the Court):-

- Q. What do you know regarding the casualty to Pte Aubut?
- A. About 21.15 hrs December 16th, 1918 I was dancing in a Café at Courceilles Motte. I heard that Pte Aubut had been shot, and I immediately proceeded to the spot where the shooting took place. I found Pte Aubut severely wounded, and Pte Beliveau and I carried him to a house near by.
- Q. Who reported to you that Pte Aubut had been shot?
- A. Pte Beliveau came to the Café. I then ran over with civilians to get him.
- Q. Is that all you know of the case?
- A. Yes.

FIFTH WITNESS. 257167 Pte Beliveau, J.C. 87th Bn Canadian Infantry. (Questioned by the Court)

- Q. Where you at Courceilles Motte the night of December 16th when Pte Aubut was shot.
- A. I was.
- Q. Before the Sentry fired did you hear him challenge you?
- A. Yes.
- Q. How many times did you hear the Sentry challenge you?
- A. After the first challenge I ran away and did not hear anyone.
- Q. What were you doing when you were challenged?
- A. Going through the lines of cars for a short cut.
- Q. Did you know that it was forbidden to go through the Station?
- A. Yes but we had used that short cut before without being challenged.
- Q. When he challenged you, what did you do?
- A. Bertrand and myself ran away. Then I heard a shot and saw that Pte Aubut was wounded, and we ran up to the road and brought civilians back to get Aubut. About ten minutes later we carried him to a civilian house. Then an Officer with a Stretcher Bearer came to dress his wounds. They carried him back to the Station. We then went back to our billet.
- Q. Are you of the opinion that the sentry who fired carried out his duty?
- A. Yes.



FIFTH WITNESS, Pte. Beliveau, J.C., Contd.

Q. What did Aubut say when you came back to him?

A. Take my rifle and kill me.

Q. Did he make any remark as to whether he was shot by accident or by mistake?

A. No.

Q. Was there anything else he said or asked for?

A. He asked for a Doctor.

SIXTH WITNESS Dr. A. Marcq, Courceilles-Motte, (Documentary, translated) states;

At about 10 p.m. Dec. 16th., 1918, a civilian lady in company with a British soldier came to me and begged me to go to the Rue de Gracie to dress the wounds of a wounded soldier. When I arrived there he had been taken to the Station. In the vicinity of the station I found a soldier lying on a stretcher, face faced and covered with perspiration, moaning low. The beat of the pulse was hardly perceptible. Lifting the covering which was around him, I saw under his sweater the intestines coming from his abdomen through an irregular orifice of a diameter of 5 centimetres under the left rib at the ~~pink~~ junction of the breast line and the navel. The ~~abdomen~~ intestine was perforated in several places as well as the stomach and decomposed food was coming from the opening.

The opening at point of entry was very small and regular, situated a few fingers width above the right posterior about 10 centimetres from the spinal column.


The passage of the projectile had an oblique direction from low to high, right to left and ~~front~~ back to front.

I may say that I think that the wound was caused from a shot from a service weapon of small calibre.

The wounded man died in my presence at about 11.00 hours, Dec. 16th. 1918.




