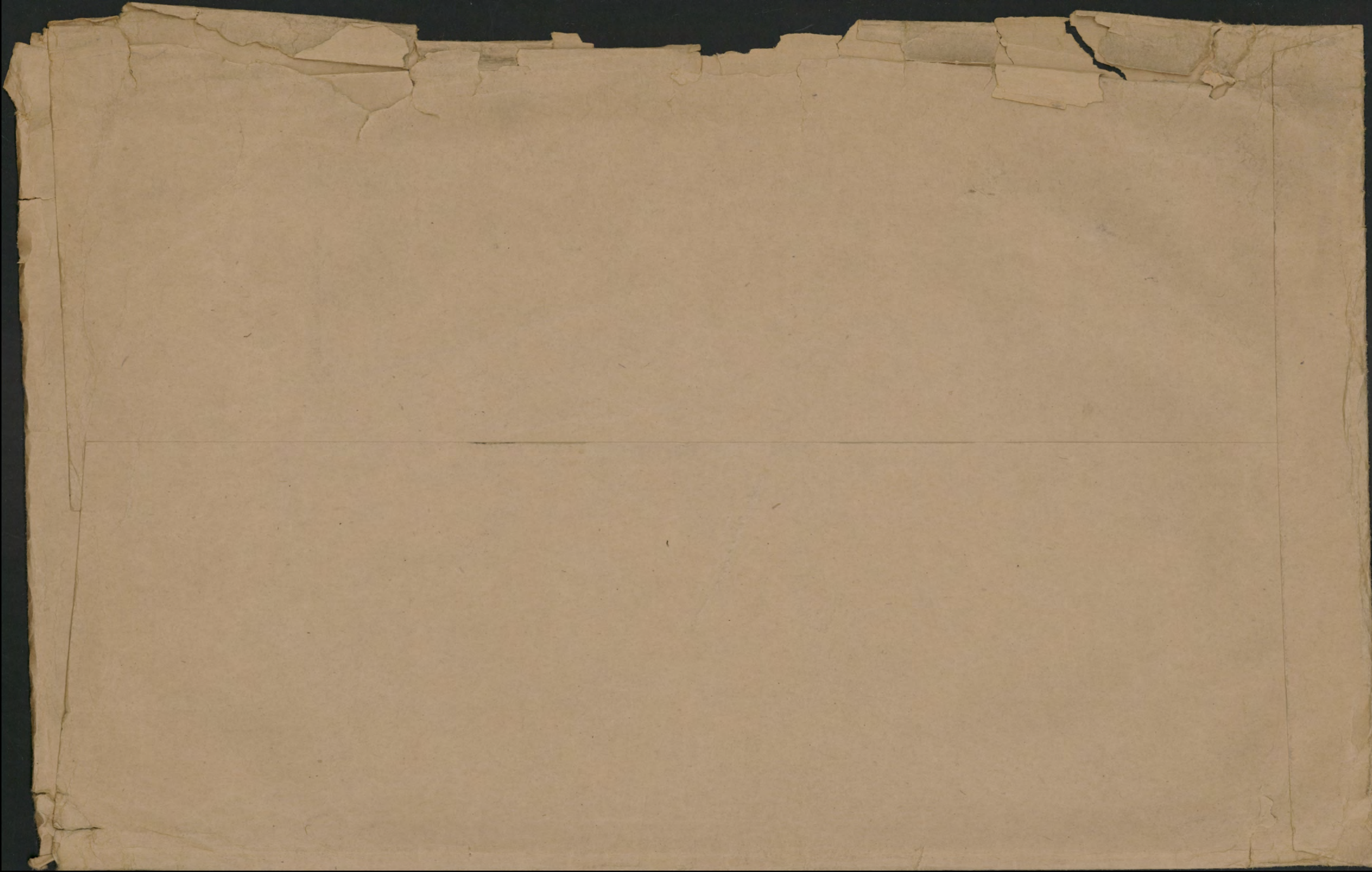

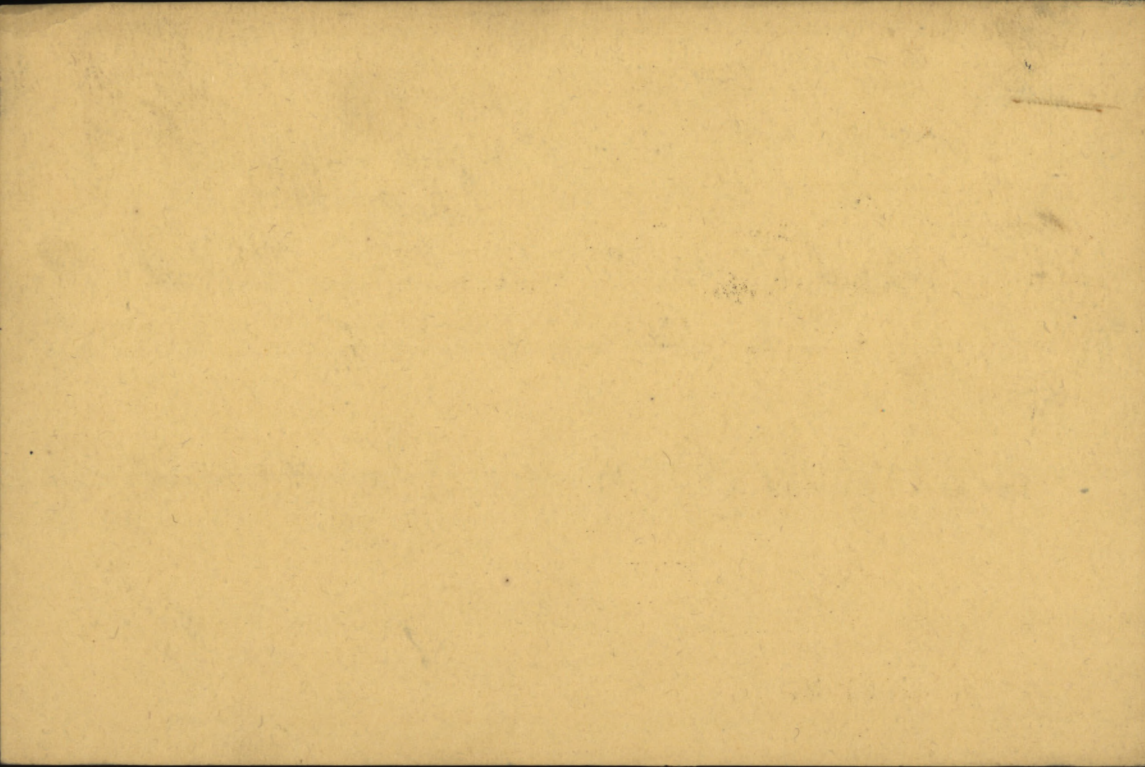

CONDITION ON ADMISSION AND PROGRESS OF CASE

Past Illnesses:- Rheumatic Fever when 7 years old. Otherwise negative. At time of enlistment was perfectly healthy. Enlisted Feb. 13.1915 in 5th C.M.Rs. To England in July 1915, thence to France September, 1915.

Present Illness:- In June 1916 complained of stiffness of all joints, accompanied by shooting pains, worse in morning, eased by exercise. No swelling of any joint, pain along shin bones. Admitted to rest camp and evacuated through usual channels to England. Medical History sheet states he was 66 days in Keighley War Hospital "Myalgia". C.C.H. Bromley 26 days Mitral Stenosis. The remainder of time was spent in various Hospitals and Convalescent Camps as Valvular Disease Heart.

While on leave in London May 1st 1918 states he had a Haemorrhage from lung extending over 4 days and was admitted to #2 General, London, Eng. No entry on M.H.S.

Inspection:- Pale, anaemic, poorly nourished, weight stripped 110, (weight on enlistment 130) Marked clubbing of fingers, otherwise negative. Thorax - long type, sub costal angle 45°, marked retraction both supra-clavicular fossae especially the right. Anterior percussion note slightly impaired left apex. No definite adventitious breath sounds. No change vocal fremitus or vocal resonance. Posterior - No impairment percussion resonance. Breath sounds vesicular - no change vocal fremitus or vocal resonance. Pulse - small, low tension, regular, vessel wall just palpable. Heart - Point of maximum intensity seen and felt 5th space 3 1/2" from mid-sternal line. No definite thrill felt at rest. Relative cardiac dullness begins 4th space extends 4" to left and 1" to right of mid-sternal line.

FAMILY HISTORY

(Tuberculosis, mental or nervous diseases.) At apex well marked presystolic murmur heard; second sound clear. At base sounds clear P₂ ++. On walking 200 yards, moderate speed, patient is exhausted. Pulse at rest 100, after climbing 15 steps 132; returns to 100 in 4 minutes. Respirations at rest 18, after climbing 15 steps 24, returning to 20 in two minutes.

TREATMENT 8. 3. 19. Urinalysis: Acid, 1020, trace albumin, Sugar nil, a single hyaline cast and occasional leucocyte and epithelial cell.

8. 3. 19 X-Ray Chest: Enlarged hila and considerable peribronchial fibrosis. No tubercular lesion. Small vertical heart shadow. Blood Pressure 98/62. Other symptoms normal.
