CONDITION ON ADMISSION AND PROGRESS OF CASE. Patient developed a carcinoma of the

rectum overseas. It was inoperable when he reported sick but a colostomy done in the left lower quadrant of the abdomen to relieve obstruction. Since that time he has been living in the country under his own control. On the evening of the 24th of June patient had a rather severe haemorrhage from the mucous membrane of the sigmoid which showed itself external. He was admitted to hospital with the haemorrhage under control. Since then he has had no further trouble. The growth in the rectum was growing very slow. His general condition is good considering the extent of cancer involvement. The colostomy wound is healing well and there is no necessity for his further stay in hospital.
