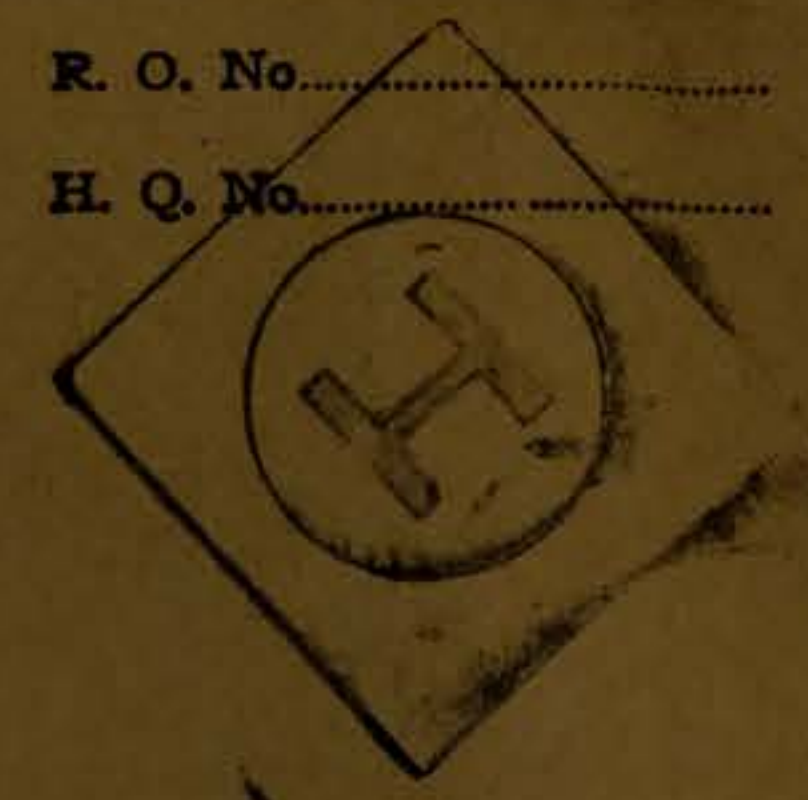

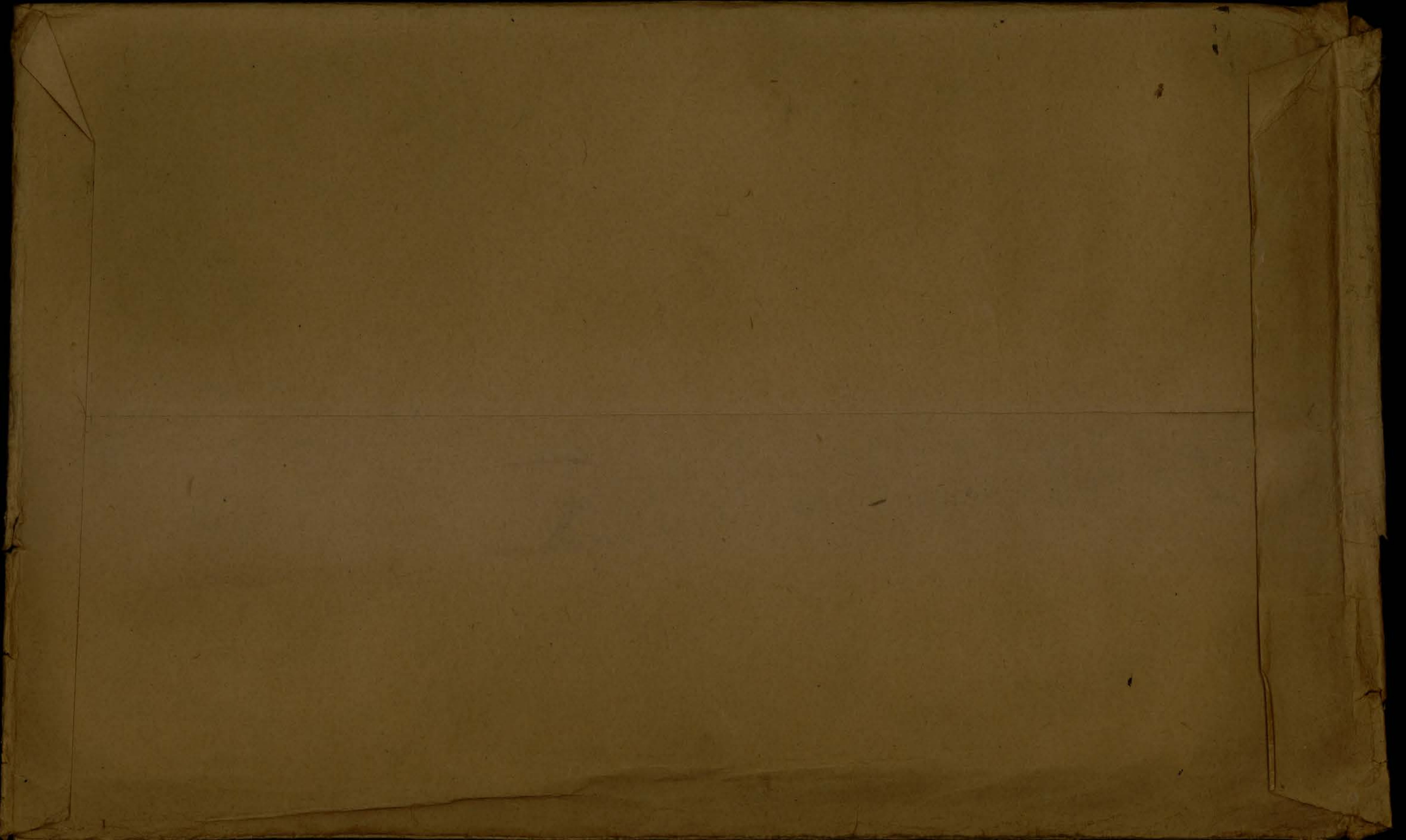

## Standing Orders as Regards Trains Proceeding with Details of Reinforcements.

36

1. The Senior Officer on the train is responsible for the discipline of all on the train. His compartment will be indicated by a label attached to the door.
2. He will ascertain in ample time before starting that there are on the train the proper rations for the journey.
3. He will arrange with the R.T.O. to place all the men, belonging to each formation, in the same part of the train.
4. He will issue the necessary orders to the senior officer or non-commissioned officer of each formation.
5. He will tell off a guard for the train, of 25 per cent. of the strength of troops travelling, which will be located in a separate vehicle or vehicles from the rest of the men. In the case of complete units moving by train, the strength of the guard will be left to the discretion of the O.C. unit.
6. If the journey is a long one, arrangements will be made to relieve the guard en route.
7. The guard will remain armed and equipped throughout its period of duty.
8. One or more officers will be detailed to the guard.
9. A N.C.O. or senior soldier will be placed in charge of each vehicle. He will at once make a list of all men in his carriage. He will detail 2 men, one on each side of the carriage or truck who will assist him in carrying out the train orders.
10. No man is to travel on the top of, or on the steps of, a vehicle. Men have been killed owing to doing so.
11. No officer or man is to be allowed to travel on the engine or in the compartment or brake van set apart for the French Railway Staffs.
12. No man is allowed to leave the train at any but authorised stopping places.
13. On arrival at an authorised stopping place, the guard, mentioned in para. 5, will detrain as soon as the train stops, before any other men are allowed to leave the carriages. Sentries will be posted at once on all exits, refreshment rooms and any points indicated by the R.T.O. Sentries will be placed at latrines, washing places, and at all exits from the station to warn men when time is drawing near for departure.
14. The guard will see that men do not straggle, and will be responsible that no men leave the station premises on any pretext. Men will not be allowed to enter any station Refreshment Room.
15. If the O.C. train find it necessary to issue rations or to perform any other service which cause delay at any but the authorised stopping places, he will at once inform the R.T.O.
16. No wine or spirits will be allowed on the train.
17. All men will be warned of the length of the halt, and ordered to parade outside their carriages five minutes before the train is due to start.
18. Before the train leaves the station the officer or N.C.O. in charge of each party will assure himself that all his men are on board and will report to the O.C. train guard.
19. In the event of any man being missing, the O.C. train will report the name and the number and the regiment of the man to the R.T.O. at the next stopping station, stating when the man left the train. The arms and accoutrements of missing men will be handed over to the R.T.O. at the first stopping station.
20. The officer in charge of train will report at once to the D.A.D.R.T., at the Regulating Station where the train is split up, the number of missing men, if any.
21. Any man left behind at a station will report at once to the R.T.O.
22. Whenever a train is split up, at the Regulating Station or elsewhere, the Senior Officer of each new train will report to the R.T.O. and will receive from him the movement order for all parties moving by his train.
23. No British Officer, soldier or civilian, will be allowed to join the train without the authority in writing of the R.T.O.
24. N.C.O.'s and men in charge of vehicles will be responsible that no unauthorised persons enter their compartment.
25. The rations provided on the trains in addition to the unexpended portion of the day's rations are only to be consumed at the proper rate, viz., one day's ration for each day of the journey.
26. The iron ration is on no account to be touched.
27. The R.T.O. will furnish the O.C. the train and each Officer in charge of a party with a form giving the following information:—

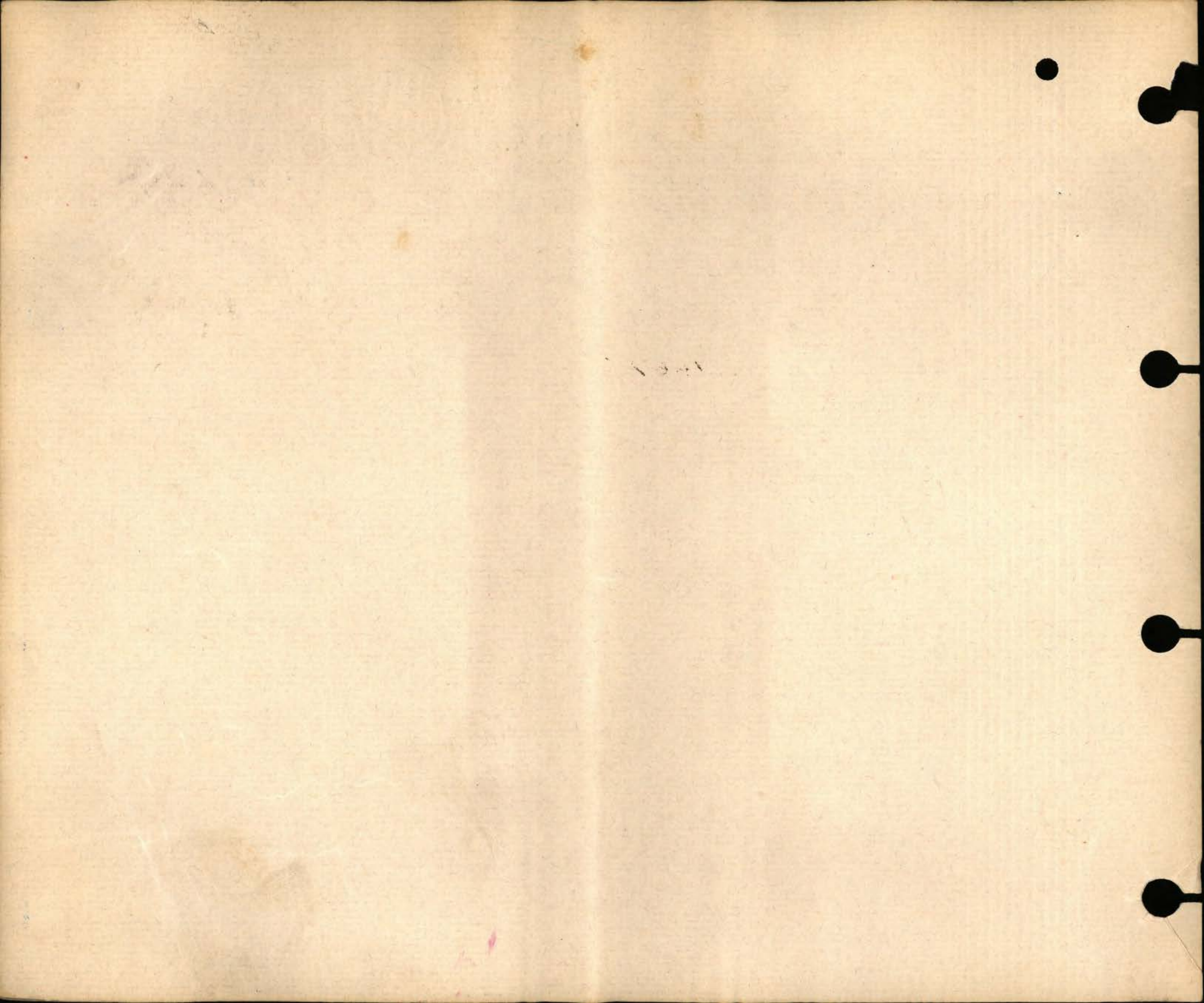

The Court having assembled pursuant to order, proceed to inquire into the death of No 449302 Pte Convey John, one of a draft for the 14<sup>th</sup> Battalion, C.E.F. Killed en route ARQUES to ACHEUX.

First Evidence.

Major R. E. Wallace, O. C. No 3 Coy 1<sup>st</sup> Canadian Entrenching Battalion, having been sworn in, states:-

No 449302, Pte Convey, John, was a member

of my company and as such was permanently employed on the transport.

R. D. Dallyon M.D.

Second Evidence.

Captain John Rankine, C. A. M. C. Medical Officer 1<sup>st</sup> Canadian Trenching Battalion, having been sworn, states:-

While en route near Boulogne, I was summoned to see a man who was injured. I climbed up on top of a railroad car and could see him lying on top of the truck. Before I could get to him, the train started, and as soon as it stopped I went to the man and found him dead, his injuries being such as to have produced immediate death. Under my instructions, he was lowered off the car to a stretcher, covered with a blanket and handed into the charge of the Station Agent. I copied his name and number from his identity disc as follows:-

449302 Private Convey John

J. Rankine Capt. Comd  
M.D. 1<sup>st</sup> Trenching Batt.

Third Evidence.

No A 40800 Corporal Spalding, A.L. having been sworn, states:-

I was Corporal in charge of the transport and horse cars. I posted No 449302 Pte Convey, John, as piqueet in horse car, giving him instructions to look after the horses. When the train stopped I was informed that Pte Convey had been killed on top of car. I saw the body

and recognised it as that of Pte Convey. I have no further evidence to offer  
J. L. Spalding.

No 22154, Pte Hunter, K. having been sworn states:

I have heard the evidence of No A 40800 Corp. Spalding, J. L. read to me, and corroborate it in every detail. I have nothing to add to Corporal Spalding's evidence.

Fifth Evidence.

No 438874 Pte Lusk, U. S. on draft for 15<sup>th</sup> Battalion C. E. F. having been sworn, states:

Owing to crowded condition of car in which I was travelling, I was sitting in brakeman's seat. I saw a man on top of the car towards the rear of the train. He was struck on the head by the steel girder of a bridge and knocked down, and lay on the top of the car. A man passed me running towards the injured man and said to me "Go for the officers, when the train stops" which I did. I saw the body removed from the top of the car. The man was dead. I afterwards heard that he was Pte Convey. I have no further evidence to give.
