CONDITION ON ADMISSION AND PROGRESS OF CASE Breathless, Palpitation. Trouble  
 began two years ago when he first noticed that on walking up hill or doing any active exercise he lost his breath, at times too he noticed palpitation of the heart. He never was actually laid up with sickness until Feby 15th 1918 when he had a very severe attack of dyspnoea and palpitation of the heart. He was in bed from middle of Feby till May 8th in Taplow Eng. He got well enough to walk about the ward and was given leave, but after 4 days had to return to Hospital. He was confined to Hospital in Kirkdale 9 weeks then came to Canada.

Physical Examination - Man sits in bed in almost upright position; Breathing is laboured, noisy, almost Cheyne Stokes at times. His face is pale, tinged with yellow, conjunctivae jaundiced a little. Lips, ears & M.M. are cyanotic. Man looks weak sick and weary. He has frequent attacks of coughing. Sputum is very thick, tenacious, and for last two days Oct. 8th & 9th has been first blood streaked and later quite markedly bloody. He has had no haemorrhages.

Resp. Sys. - Lungs are slightly emphysematous, rather more so on left side. Expiratory murmur is prolonged. There is rather marked dullness behind from the middle of the scapula to the base of the right lung. Moist rales are heard over the whole thorax, both behind and in front. Breath sounds not very well heard over area of impaired resonance behind. The cough is racking, sputum as above noted.

Circ. Sys. - Pulse 80. Regular gallop rhythm, volume small. tension moderate. Arterial walls not hardened/ Cardiac Dullness.
