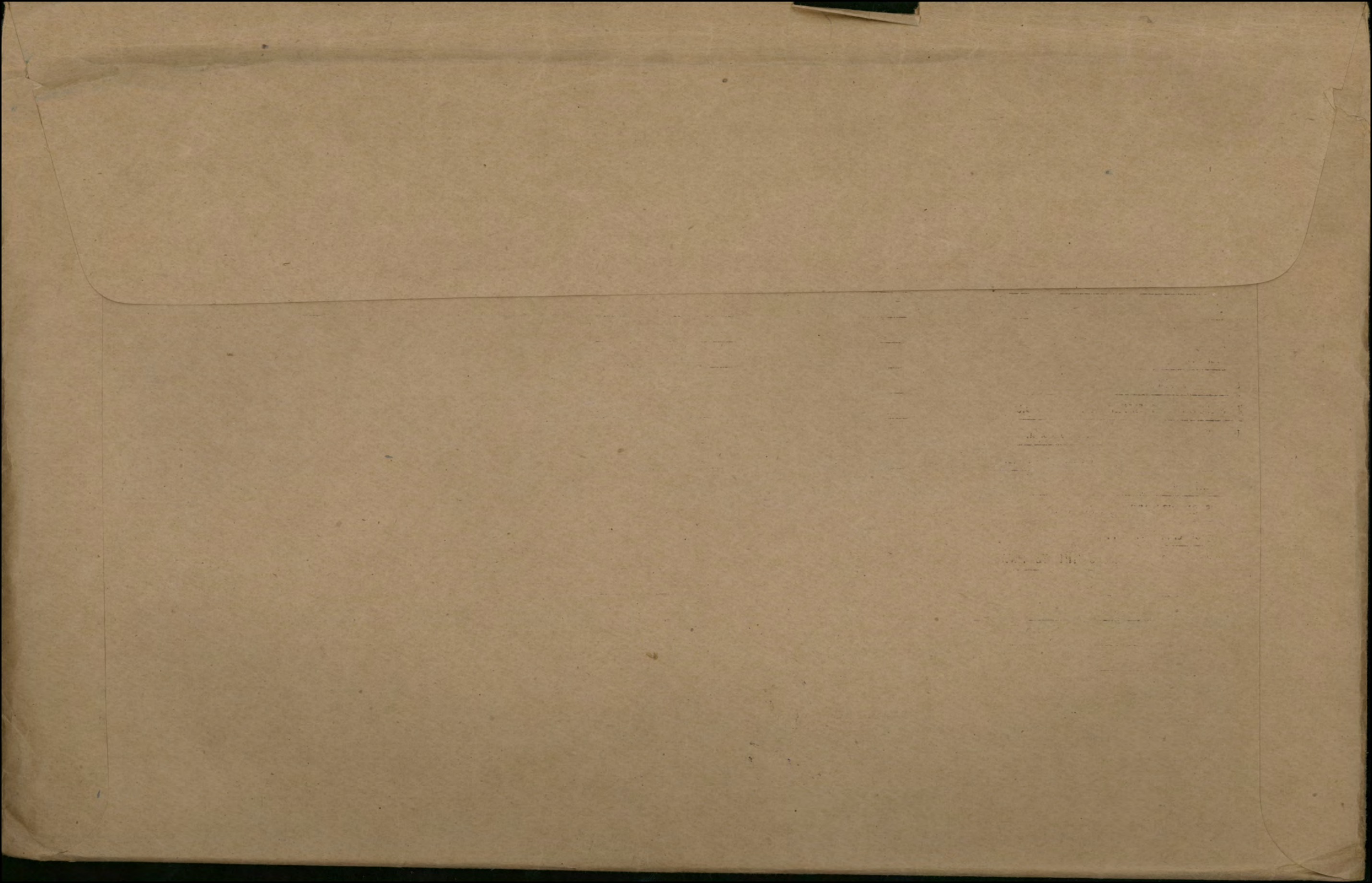

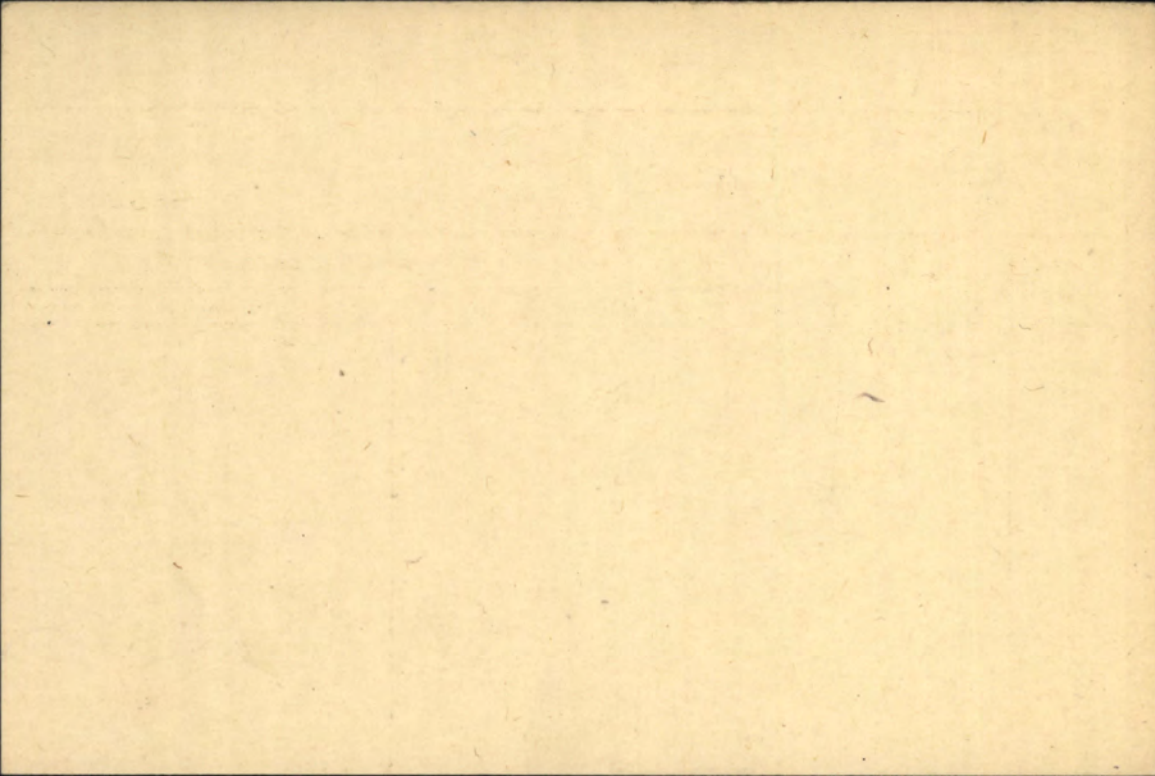

1st Witness. 71918, Pte. (A/Q.M.S.) LUMSDEN, G., Traffic Control, 2nd Canadian Division, states:

I saw pte. LAYETTE alive for the last time at 17.00 hours on 23rd October instant. He was in a perfectly normal condition. He asked me for some coal oil for his lamp. This was in the Q.M. Stores. I did not see him again until about 7.15 a.m. on 24th October instant when I went to his billet to wake him.

The room was dark as the blinds were over the windows. I found him lying on his back on the wooden floor. His feet were wide apart, his left arm was above his head, the palm of his hand open. His right hand was clutching the rail of an overturned bench. I went and got Sgt. Craig who came with a light. I then noticed that his eyes were open. There was no particular expression on his face.

We left him and everything else in the room, as it was until the M.O. came. I reported the matter to Lieut. Gerard, Traffic Officer. I was present with the M.O. when he examined the body. I have known him for about 12 months. He was a very heavy cigarette smoker and his hands were always shaky.

3rd Witness. Capt. P. F. McCUE, C.A.M.C. attached 6th Field Ambulance, states:

I am at present relieving the M.O. attached 20th Canadian Battalion.

On 24th October instant at billet 6 Rue Alsace, ANICHE about 09.00 hours, I examined the body of a soldier who was carrying an identity disc stamped - Pte. LAYETTE, 22nd Cdn. Battalion.

The body was then wrapped in a blanket. I found a wound on the left temple about 3 inches from the left corner of the left eye extending backwards. It was an incised wound about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches long, extending to and into the bone. No fracture was to be seen. There was a cut on the bone. I did not observe any bruising. There was considerable clotted blood on the hair. A small stain on the floor and several spots of blood on the front of his trousers. I could not find any blood elsewhere in the room. I looked very carefully but could find no blood or hair on anything in this room or the adjoining rooms which might have caused the wound. The man had evidently been dead for several hours, at least four and a half to five hours. There was vomit on the floor. There was an open tin of Maconochie rations on the table and some of the contents on an enamelled plate. I do not know if the vomit came from this man.

There was also a Tommy Cooker on the table. I would say that the blow which produced the wound was sufficient to have caused death.

2nd Witness. Capt. H. C. ALLISON, C.A.M.C. attached 19th Canadian Battalion, states:

At about 08.45 hours I attended at billet No. 6 Rue Alsace ANICHE where I found a body of a soldier who was identified to me as Pte. LAYETTE.

I found the body lying flat on the back with the head about 1 foot away from the edge of a wooden bunk. He was facing the window. His legs were stretched out. He was gripping with his right hand the foot rail of an ordinary small bench which was upset against the wall.

He appeared to have been dead for 4 or 5 hours, the body was rigid and cold. His face had a set expression as though he had some pain. On his left temple there was a small cut about an inch long. This cut was about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches above the eye. A clean cut right down to the bone. On the bone there was a slight dent about  $\frac{3}{8}$  inch long in the centre of the cut. Considerable blood matted in his hair and the blood had also run down to his eye. There was a stain of blood on the floor where his head rested.

He was clothed in a shirt, riding breeches and socks.







He was wearing neither tunic nor boots.

From his appearance and the appearance of his bed, I should judge that he had been in bed. There was vomit on the floor near his feet. He was lying just outside his bed almost at right angles to it with his head nearest to it.

I can not say whether he died from the blow which caused the wound, or not, though it is possible. I examined the room carefully, but could find nothing from which I could form an opinion as to the manner in which he received the wound.

4th Witness. 505961 Spr. W. BENNETT, Traffic Control, 2nd Canadian Division, states:-

On the night 23/24 October, I was sleeping in the same room in Billet 6, Rue Alsace as Pte. MASON and another man. This room was below that occupied by Pte. LAYETTE. Neither I nor the others in my room heard any noise or disturbance during the night, nor any indication that there was anything wrong with Pte. LAYETTE.

5th Witness. 73586, Sgt. W. CRAIG, states:-

I am on permanent traffic staff, 2nd Canadian Division. At about 0700 hours on 24th October instant with Q.M.S. LUMSDEN I went into the room occupied by Pte. LAYETTE and found him lying on the floor apparently dead. We were careful to leave everything in the room exactly as it was except a saddle which I needed and took away.

I have known the deceased for about a year. While he kept himself to himself a good deal, he had no enemies that I am aware of.

6th Witness. Lieut. D.E.GERRARD, Traffic Officer, 2nd Canadian Division, states:-

I reached the body at about 07.30 hours on 24th October instant.

I noticed vomit on the floor at his feet containing beans. There was a tin of Maconochie on the table, about half the contents were gone. What was left was on a plate, it had not been heated and he had not eaten from the plate, the knife and fork were clean, the spoon may have been used.

There were blood stains on his lap. His tunic was on the upper bunk, it was not stained. I examined this room and the adjoining rooms, but could find nothing that might have caused the wound. He was cold when I found him. From the appearance of the bench I should say it had been overturned before he died. It had no sharp edges. The deceased was a man of quiet habits and had given no trouble.

7th Witness. 431083, Pte. FARLEY, W. of the permanent staff Traffic Control, 2nd Canadian Division, states:-

On 23rd October instant, Pte. LAYETTE complained to me about feeling very sick and by a movement of his hand indicated that he felt considerable pain in his chest. He had complained to me about feeling sick a few days before.

8th Witness. 76323, Sgt. S. KELLOCK, Permanent Staff, Traffic Control, 2nd Canadian Division, states:-

I knew the deceased about a year and a half ago. He was an excessive cigarette smoker. He was in the habit of getting up in the night to smoke. He was very shaky and his lungs seemed to be affected.







I examined the room at 09.45 hours on 24th October instant. I found the body of Pte. LAYETTE wrapped in a blanket.

The bench was across the fire place where the stove had previously been. There was blood on the seat of the bench and on the floor below the centre of the mantelpiece. The vertical sides of the mantelpiece were made of marble and had sharp edges. The vomit was about opposite the centre of the mantelpiece. There were some stains on the left side of the mantelpiece which I took to be blood.

It would have been possible for him while sitting on the bench in front of the mantelpiece to have fallen forward and struck his head against the side of the mantelpiece which was sharp enough to have caused the wound. There was a coal oil lamp on the left of the mantelpiece.

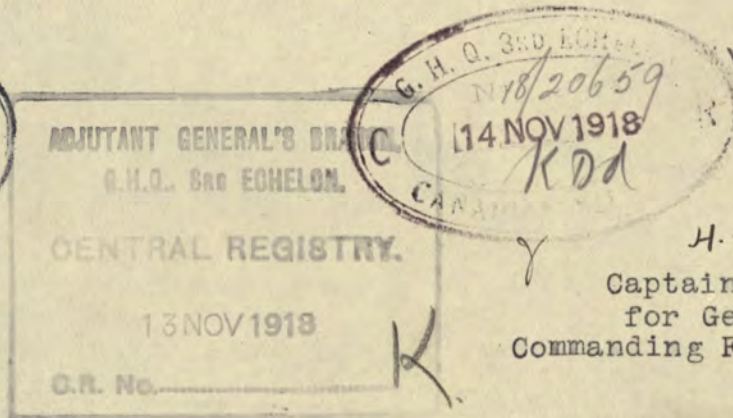

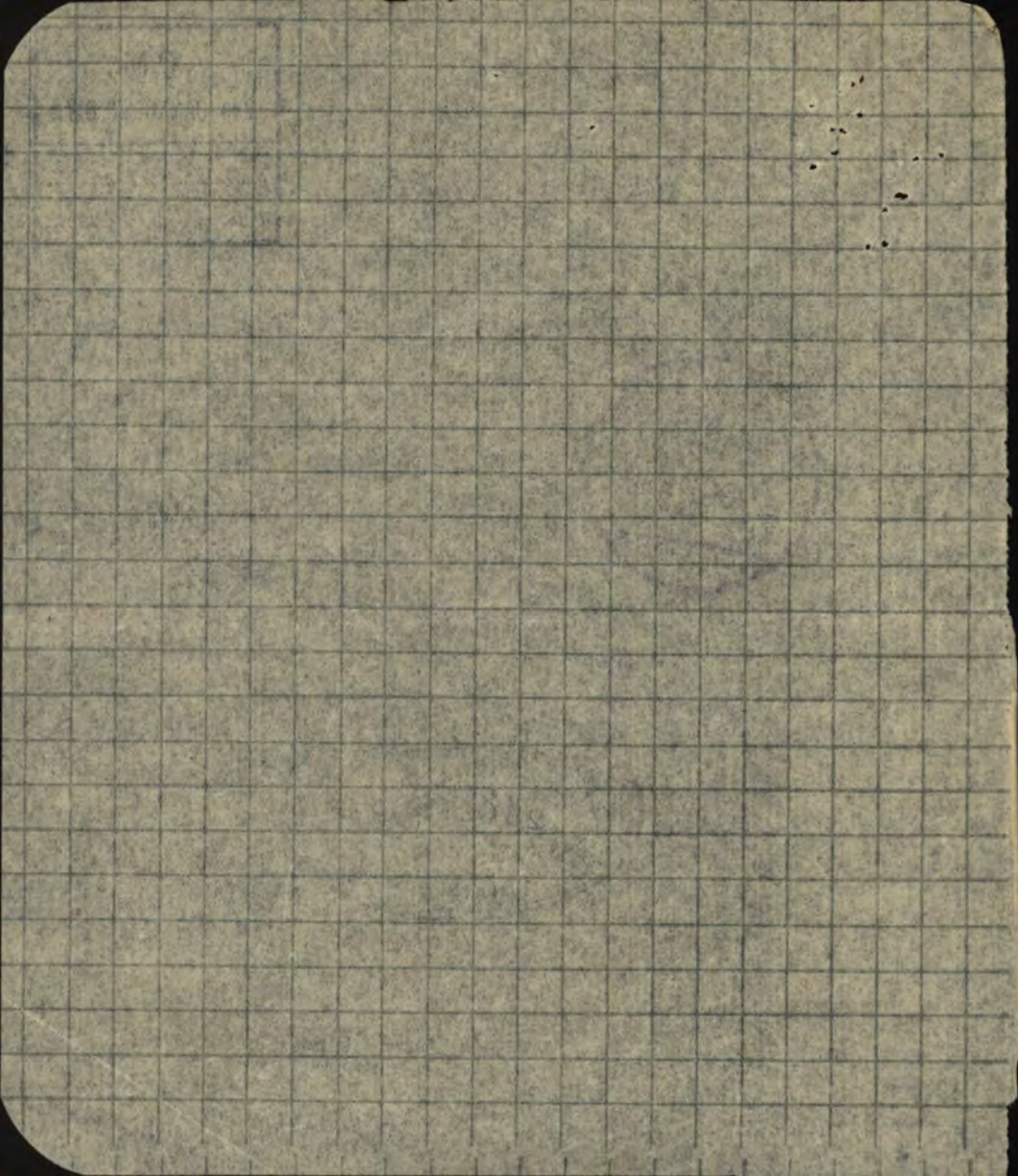

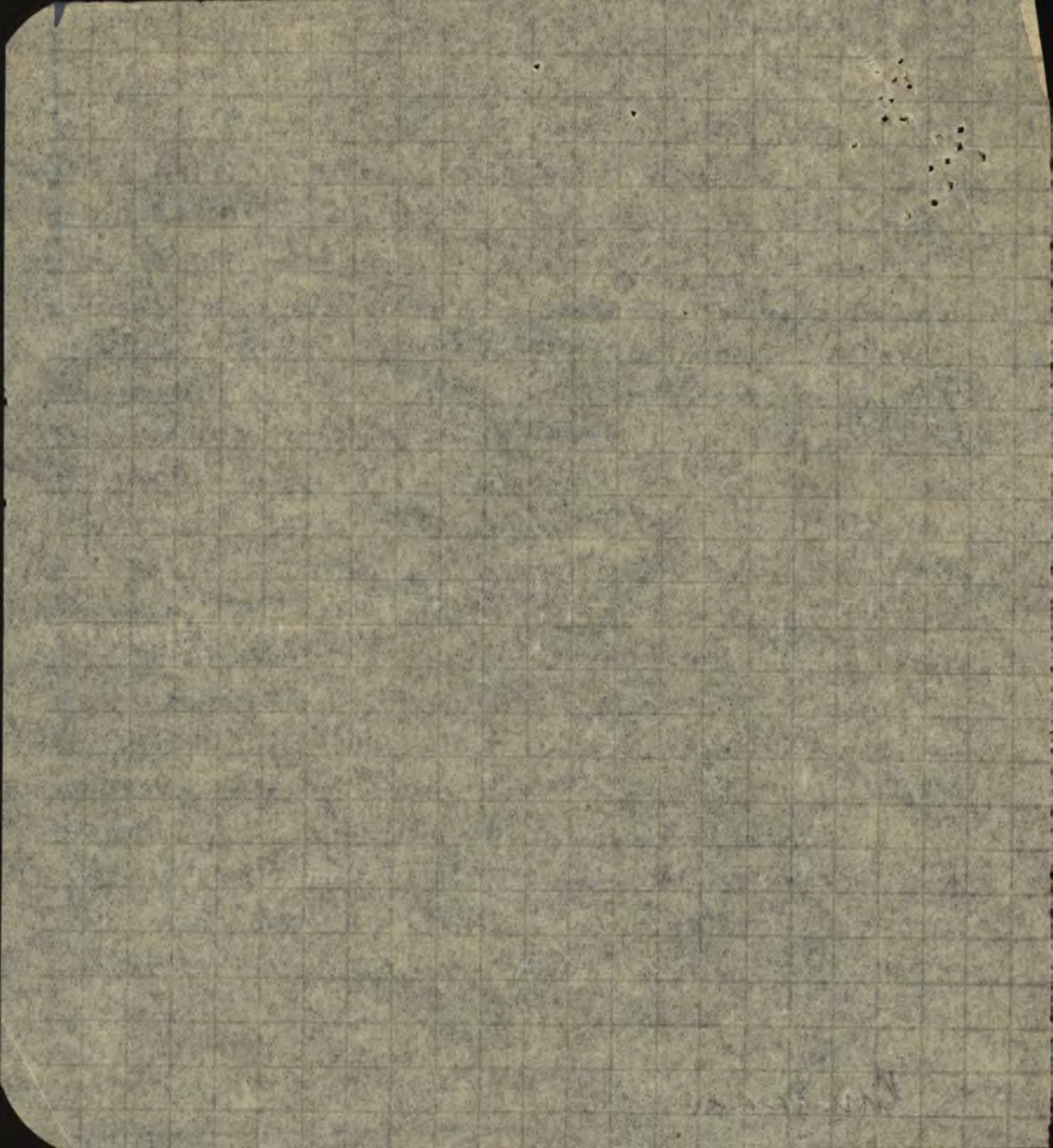


At about 9-45 A.M. on the 24<sup>th</sup> inst I visited Billet  
No 6 Rue Alsace which is occupied by Traffic Control  
I found in a room the body of Pte Lafayette rolled in  
a blanket about 3 yards from where he was discovered  
by Sgt. Janssen. Upon looking at the body I noticed  
a cut about 3 inches above the left eye which ~~was~~  
apparently had been done with a sharp instrument.  
I then searched the room finding blood stains on a  
form which lay in front of the fire place. Everything  
pointed to the fact that the deceased had  
suddenly taken ill sat on the form fell forward  
his head coming in contact with the sharp  
edge of the fire place which is solid marble  
& sharp thus causing the wound. About where  
his head <sup>was</sup> came in contact with the fire place  
I found a few stains which appeared to be  
blood. Through personal acquaintance I know that  
the deceased ~~was in the habit of~~ was a heavy  
cigarette smoker & in the habit of getting up through  
the night to smoke also that he had a victim  
to lung trouble.

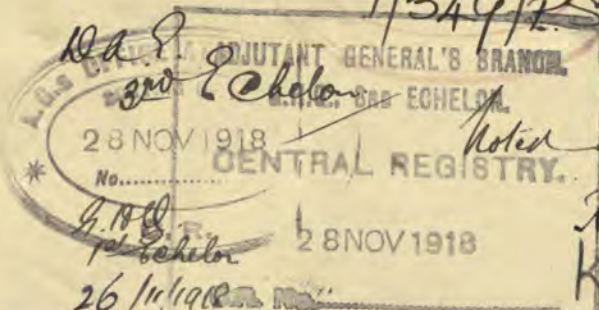

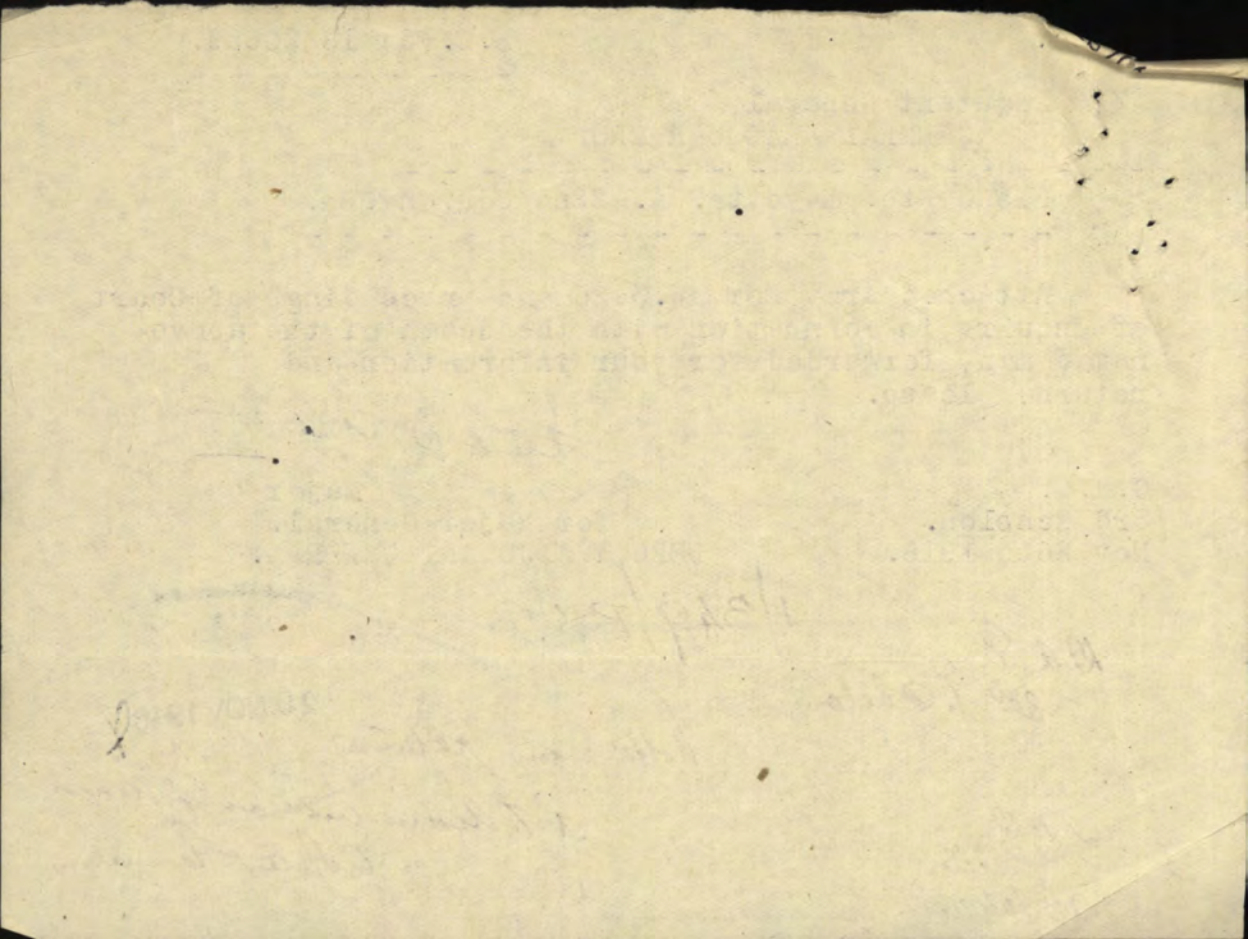

REPORT ON ACCIDENTAL OR SELF-INFLICTED INJURIES

**INSTRUCTIONS.**

1. These forms are to be completed in all cases of accidental or self-inflicted injuries, involving a soldier's absence from duty, whether due to the man's own act, or that of a comrade, or to other extraneous circumstances.

2. Where several casualties occur as the result of one accident, one form is to be completed for each Officer or other rank injured, but only one set of statements from the witnesses of the accident need be attached.

3. Full statements are to be taken by an Officer from the witnesses of the accident. These statements will be signed by the witnesses making them, and by the Officer who takes them, and will be forwarded with this Form. Where it is intended to take disciplinary action, copies of these statements should be retained by the Unit for use in lieu of a summary of evidence.

4. Where it is possible to obtain it, a statement from the injured man will also be forwarded. This, however, should not be used as evidence against him in any subsequent disciplinary proceedings.

**Special Instructions as to Evidence in Cases of Self-Inflicted Wounds.**

5. In these cases the statements mentioned in paragraphs 2 and 3 above should bring out all material points, *e.g.*, statements to the effect that the witness was with the accused standing on the fire step (or sitting in a dug-out); that the accused was cleaning his rifle; position of safety catch, magazine, etc., if known; muzzle of rifle on toe of foot; hand on muzzle; that accused pulled trigger; that the rifle was afterwards examined and an empty cartridge case was found in chamber; that accused was seen to be wounded; what accused said ("I have shot myself," "I did not know it was loaded," etc.).

6. A soldier is specially trained in the safe use of his rifle and revolver, and evidence of any neglect of the ordinary precautions as to their handling in such cases usually has considerable bearing on the question of negligence. In cases of wilful self-wounding the fullest possible evidence should be obtained; unless the evidence is conclusive this charge should not be used. The charge will therefore usually be laid under Sec. 40 Army Act—"Conduct to the prejudice of good order and military discipline in wounding himself through negligently handling a rifle," and an alternative charge to this effect should be made, even if the accused is to be tried under Section 18 for wilful maiming.

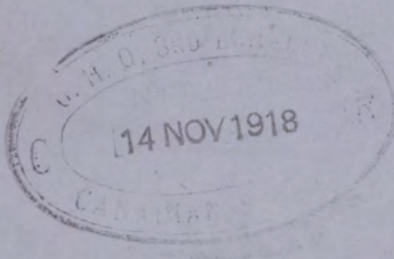
