PROCEEDINGS of COURT of INQUIRY held in Belgium this 12th day of September 1916, by order of 12th Canadian Inf. Brigade to ascertain the cause of death of No. 177411 Pte Linstead T.H.

The Court being convened proceeded to examine witnesses as follows :-

1st Witness. Lieut H. A. Peverley being called stated that he was first advised of the deceased's death at 8.50 AM, 8th Sept. 1916 by Corporal Larnder who reported the fact to him at his dug-out, stating that Pte Linstead had been killed while tempering with an unexploded shell half an hour previously. Lieut. Peverley stated that he went immediately to the place where deceased was killed and saw the body lying in the trench terribly mutilated.

Lieut., Peverley on being questioned stated that he had warned his Section about handling any shells of any description that might be found about the trenches or fields.

2nd Witness. No. 129539 Corporal Larnder, F. E. States :-  
About 8.30 AM 8th September L/Corpl. Henderson came down from his position at G. 5. and told me that Private Linstead had blown his head off tempering with an unexploded shell. He asked me to go up and taken Private Jordan up to the dressing station because he had been slightly wounded as he had been standing close to Private Linstead when he was killed. I went up to G. 5 and saw remains of Private Linstead lying there in front of his dug-out. I left immediately with Private Jordan to report to Lieut. Peverley.  
Questioned :- Corpl. Larnder stated they had all been warned at various times about playing with shells etc.

3rd Witness. No. 540019 Pte Jordan C. T., being called, stated: #  
On the night of 7th September 1916 we (meaning Linstead, myself, and some men of the 38th Battalion) found an unexploded shell in rear of the trench and some of the men tried to open it. I was then called away to go for rations. Between 8.15 am and 8.30 AM 8th September Pte Linstead brought shell around beside dug-out occupied by us and started to hammer it with a hammer. I continued the work which I was doing when shell exploded close to me.

Questioned, Pte Jordan stated that he is sure it was the above shell that exploded.

Questioned, Pte Jordan stated that Lieut. Peverley had never warned the section about playing with unexploded shells in his presence.

4th Witness. No. 177859 Lance Corpl. Henderson, G. being called stated :- The night previously I heard that the 38th Men and Pte Linstead were playing with an unexploded shell in the 38th Cookhouse (dug-out). When he (Pte Linstead) told me I warned him not to go near it any more. In the morning about 8.20 AM I went to the latrine and Private Linstead came by and went out in an open space. I called him in. As he passed in, he said he would come back later when the latrine was empty. Two minutes after he passed me I heard the explosion I thought it was a German shell and did not hurry but met Pre Laboute on the way back and he told me to come quickly. When I got to the dug-out I saw Pte Linstead lying there dead. I then discovered that Pte Jordan was slightly wounded. I went down to get Corporal Larnder to take Pte Jordan to the dressing station and at the same time to report to Lieut. Peverley. Questioned if there was any other shelling that morning L/Corpl. Henderson said "Yes, some on the right." Questioned, The Company has been warned in a lecture by Capt. Hodge not to handle enemy bombs and shells.

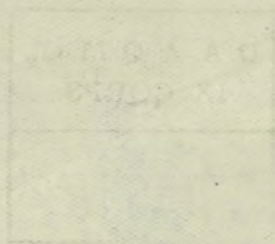
