The cause of death was found to be acute Cedema of the lungs -- the cause of which is impossible to state.

3. While he was admitted and diagnosed suffering from Pulmonary Tuberculosis the autopsy did not confirm this diagnosis.

History.

Sept. 14th 1917.

Pte. G. M. McKay.

Family History

Father died from old age, mother died when fifty five years of age - cause unknown but supposed to be liver trouble. Three sisters and three brothers living and well. No hereditary taints or tendencies as far as patient knows.

Past Illnesses

Has always been in good health up to present complaint. Denies ever having had Venereal Diseases.

Present Illness

Wounded by a small piece of Shrapnel in the back. Oct. 14th 1916. Treated at first in Dressing Station. then the wound became infected and pat. was sent back to 8th Stationary Hospital - remained there for one month and was then sent to 3rd Scottish General Hospital. after staying there for six weeks he was sent to Epsom England.

Patient first noticed a rash ^{near the wound} on the back at the base of the spine while in 3rd General Hospital. It was excessively itchy and burned. The time elapsing between the wound and the first appearance of the rash was about five weeks. After receiving treatment at different Hospitals in England pat. was finally transferred to Canada March 1917. Was placed in military Hospital at Halifax transferred to Montreal General - from there to Sanatorium in Quebec from there to Royal Victoria Hospital.

N.B. Note - Pat. passed thru a gas attack in France - had Pneumonia on the boat on the way home - was sent to T.B. Sanatorium ^{St. Agathe} in Quebec for treatment. While there rash became worse so was sent to General Hospital - Came to Sanatorium at Kitchener - stayed there three weeks and was then brought to London, arriving here two days ago. - Sept. 13th

CONDITION ON ADMISSION AND PROGRESS OF CASE History of Present Illness:-

Wounded by small piece of shrapnel in the back on October 14th, 1916. Treated at first in a Dressing Station, then the wound became infected and patient was sent back to 7th Stationary Hospital, remained there for one month and was then sent to 3rd Scottish General Hospital. After staying there for 6 weeks was sent to Epsom, England. First noticed a rash on the back at the base of the spine, near the wound, while in the 3rd General Hospital. It was excessively itchy and burned. The time elapsing between the wound and the first appearance of rash was about 5 weeks. After receiving treatment at different hospitals in England the patient was finally transferred to Canada in March, 1917. Was placed in Military Hospital at Halifax, transferred to Montreal General, from there to Sanitorium in Quebec, from there to Victoria Hospital, Montreal.

Patient passed through a gas attack in France, had Pneumonia on the boat on the way home, was sent to T.B. Sanitorium in St. Agatha, in Quebec, for treatment. While there rash became worse so was sent to General Hospital. Came to Sanitorium at Kitchener, stayed there 3 weeks and was then brought to London, arriving here two days ago, (September 13th)

Past Illness:- Has always been in good health up to present complaint. Denies ever having Venereal diseases.

FAMILY HISTORY Father died from Old Age. Mother died when 55 (Tuberculosis, mental or nervous diseases.) years of age, cause unknown, but was supposed to be liver trouble. Three Sisters and 3 Brothers living, and well. No hereditary taints or tendencies, as far as patient knows.

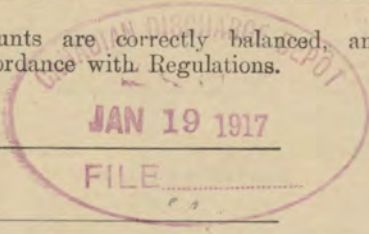

2. When men are discharged from the colours at home as medically unfit, or with claims to pension, Army Form B. 268 will be sent confirmed, together with the duplicate attestation and documents retained therein to the officer in charge of records 10 days in advance of the date for discharge in the case of invalids, and 14 days in other cases. This officer will then extract from the original attestation any documents required to complete the list of discharge documents enumerated in the margin, place them in this form, and after carefully checking the duplicate attestation with the original forward the whole to the Secretary, Royal Hospital, Chelsea. When such men are discharged abroad, the same procedure will be adopted as above, with the exception that the discharge documents will be sent to the officer in charge of records immediately after discharge takes place (except in the case of men who are granted gratuities on discharge from local battalions or companies, Royal Artillery).

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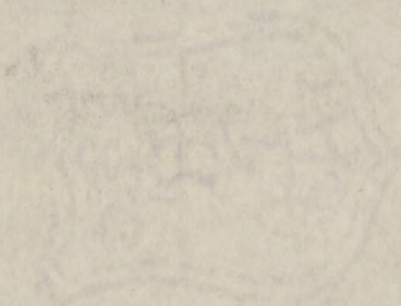
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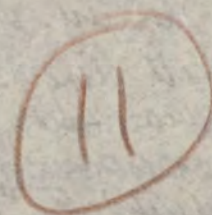

He was invalided to Canada and admitted to The Montreal General Hospital on the 23rd of April 1917 with a diagnosis of Pulmonary Tuberculosis and Eczema was made. He was transferred to Ste. Agathe for Sanitarium treatment. Later he was transferred to M.D. #1 and on the 28th of March 1918 was admitted again to The Montreal General Hospital. The body from head to foot was involved in a chronic exfoliating Dermatitis-- the skin being constantly in a raw condition which he was suffering tremendously. The lung condition shows impairment of crepitations of both basis. No T.B. was found in the sputum. On the morning of the 15th of August, he became unconscious and seemingly the rt. side of the face was paralyzed, breathing became very difficult and on the evening of the 16th instant, at 5.10 p.m. he died. Autopsy findings showed Oedema of the lungs, chronic Nephritis & Dermatitis Exfoliati. The body to be delivered over to District Depot #4.



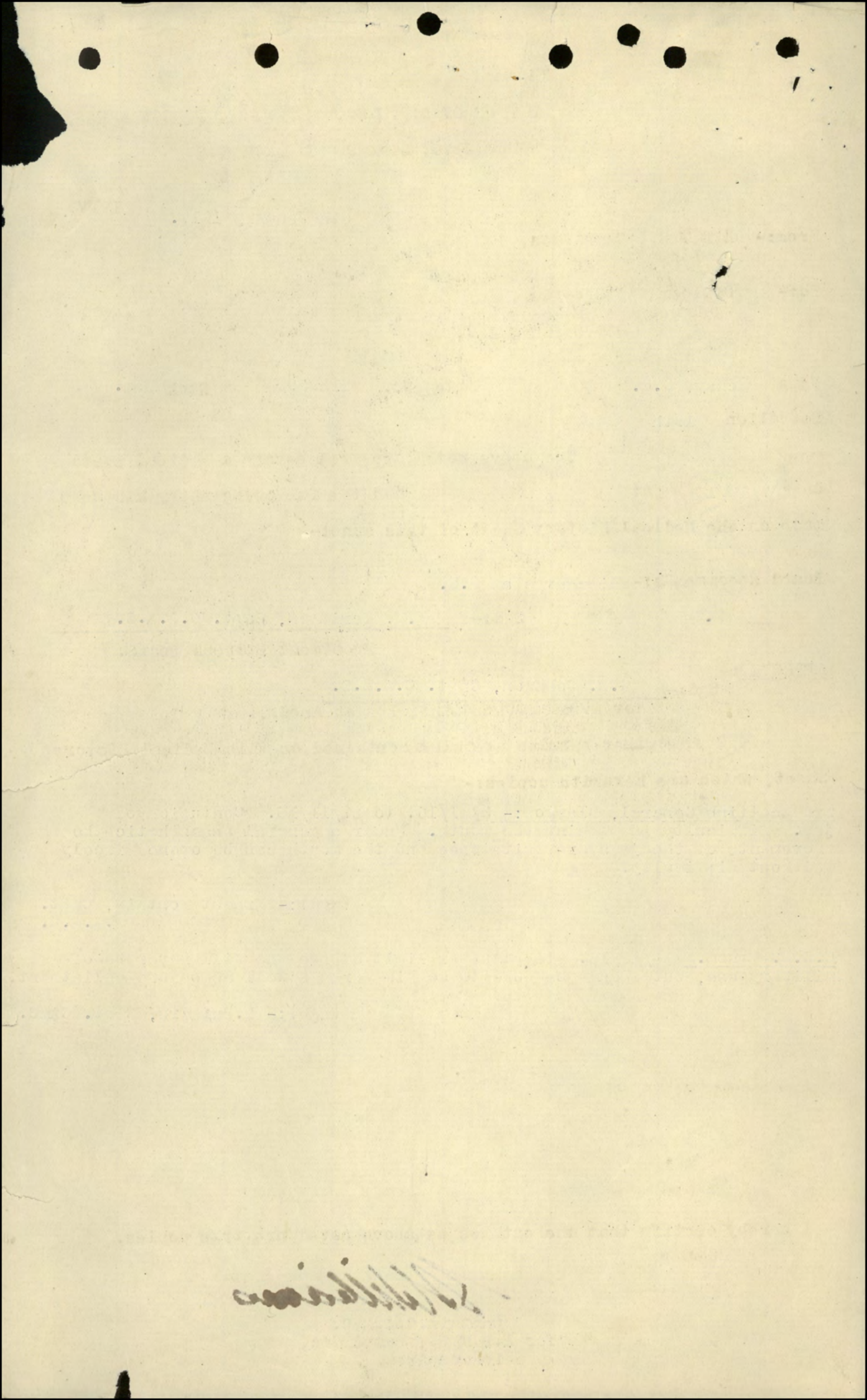
