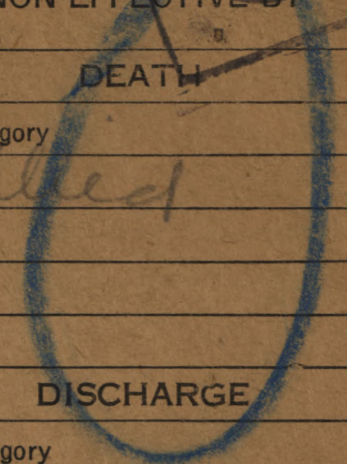

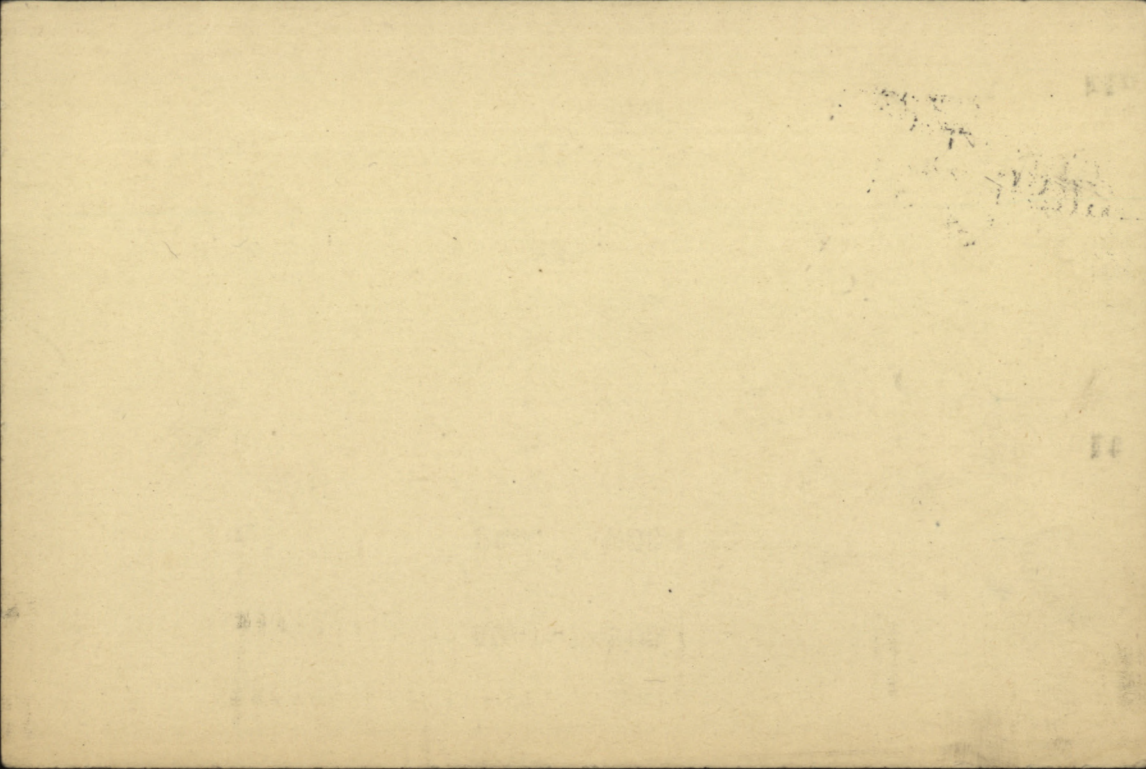

NAME

EXECUTOR

Appoint as executor some responsible person, preferably a civilian, and if possible someone who is permanently resident in the Province where the property is situate.
