On the 26th May he replied that it was impossible to trace Mrs. Sargent, as he thought it likely she had gone to Godstone with a Canadian called Hunter.



It is just possible that Pte. Sargent may be able to supply the necessary information with regard to this Canadian, but we must have his Regimental number, initials and rank and if possible, Unit. If not, he might be able to supply sufficient information as would enable the Canadian Military Authorities to identify the man.

Up to the date of joining the Service this is reported to have been a thoroughly happy marriage and they have 1 girl - 14 years of age - and twin boys now about 8 years of age, located because of their parents' separation - by the father at the addresses shown.

After joining the Service, however, and succeeding a time when the wife had been in hospital in South Wales, the husband had every reason to complain or her moral aberration with an alleged cousin (who turned out, of course, to be no cousin at all, but a man called Jarrett - married but allegedly parted from his wife) and did his best to sort out affairs, forgave her on her agreeing to walk straight again and for a long time had no reason to complain. (Possibly because he was blind to what was going on).

On the 1st May - last week - he went home to find his wife keeping company with a Canadian N.C.O., apparently in quite intimate circumstances, in the house. He ordered the Canadian out of the house. The wife said if he were to go she would go too. The husband said "very well" and the two left together. He then saw about closing up the house, got the children lodged as shown, and was on the point of returning from leave the following day, when he met his wife in the street - she said she wanted to get a few things. He asked her if she were not going to return. She said "no" - she was leaving him for ever. He let her get a few things from the house, locked the door after her and has seen nothing of her since.

Thus he does not know her present address, but as he has reason to believe that the daughter is in touch with her mother, I have asked him to endeavour to get the address from the daughter and if it is received it will be communicated through the same channel. Meanwhile it is imagined there will be little difficulty about getting into touch with the mother, who undoubtedly is staying with friends somewhere locally and her address will, almost certainly, be known to one of the parties above mentioned.

The husband, seeing the Pay and Allowances Books issued to his wife - from which the last payment was made on the 27th April and per payment was due on Monday, 3rd May, - brought this away with him, to deprive her of the use of it. I mentioned this as being rather high-handed action, asked him at once to sent this through to his daughter tasking the daughter to hand it over to her mother - and he agreed to do this immediately, realising that he must not spoil his own good case by unfairness.

The husband is thoroughly prepared to be reconciled to take her back if she will promise faithfully to abandon

Amongst the people in this case is a Mrs. B. Furnell, 60, Upper High Street, Epsom who after the events above recorded, approached the husband and to tell him that she had long known about the "carrying on" and could tell him a sad story if he wanted to hear it. He apparently did not go into any details but it is just possible this woman of the observant eye may know where the wife is now.



After some difficulty I have located this woman who is living at 31 Featherstone St., Blindley Heath, Surrey.

About a month ago I had an interview with Pte. Sargent, R., in the presence of S/Sgt. Hunter, J., of this Unit, at this particular time the husband stated he did not wish any further acquaintance with his wife, other than to collect ration and clothing coupon books which he intimated she had in her possession. His only other remark being addressed to Hunter in that "the better man wins Jack".

It appears evident that Hunter has more or less befriended this woman since she has left her home.

I have had Hunter before me for questioning in this matter and his attitude does not appear to be a case of inducing the woman away from her home. I am also inclined to feel that from what I have been privileged to see and hear that this woman may be a slightly mental case, as her attractiveness is not outstanding.

In the interests of this N.C.O. it would be appreciated if the husband and wife could be united again and have her removed further away.

- l. Following the death of the m/n NCO Lieut W.E. Cartlidge was tried for murder at 2 C.B.R.G. You will no doubt recall the case. You may also recall that a request was received from 1 Ech 21 A Gp that an expert witness, one Robert Churchill, be dispatched to give evidence at the trial. The request appears at folio 17.
- 2. The matter was one of some urgency and as a result arrangements were immediately made to send Mr. Churchill to C.B.R.G. and he was dispatched by air on 24 Oct 44, returning by boat on 28 Oct 44. Authority for his dispatch and for payment of his fees pursuant to Art 777(2) F R & I(0) was not obtained at that time.
- 3. Mr Churchill's account has now been received and is attached to folio 31 and amounts to £70.5.0. The sum of £10.10.0., which covers the fee for examining exhibits prior to the trial and is included in the above amount, has been certified as proper by the President of the Court, Brigadier Wedd (folio 26).
- 4. Mr. Churchill is a recognised expert in gun testing and ballistics and when required is employed in that capacity by the Metropolitan Police and New Scotland Yard although not a member of the police force. His evidence was considered necessary at the trial in question. The bill seems high, but that is chiefly due to the length of time Mr. Churchill was away. I do not think there is any choice but to accept it, subject to any verification you may consider necessary. I recommend that the calling of this witness and the expense involved be approved.


