

Dear Mr. Lamont: I regret the unavoidable delay in the preparation of the photographs that were taken at the Memorial Service held in memory of your boy and his comrades who lost their lives October 20th, 1943. You will find enclosed five pictures, one of which shows the Cross that was erected in memory of your son. The four other photographs are exceptionally good pictures of the officiating clergymen which it was felt you would like to have. In picture No. 1 (marked on back) they are, left to right, the trumpeter, Wing Commander Costello, R.C. Chaplain, Wing Commander Frayne, Protestant Chaplain, and Captain E.F. Mandelcorn, Hebrew Chaplain. From this picture you will be able to identify these Chaplains in the other three pictures. I am aware that your Chaplain has advised you of the Service and I trust indeed that these photos will be of some solace to you in the irreparable loss of your gallant boy. Dear Mr. Lamont:

You will have been informed through official R.C.A.F. channels that the funeral service for your son, F/O James Lamont, was to take place at the scene of the crash yesterday, July 3rd, 1946, at 2:30 o'clock Eastern Daylight time. It was felt, however, that you would like to hear some of the more intimate details of yesterday's happenings on the slope of the mountain.

Yesterday morning the official party, consisting of a Hebrew Chaplain, Captain E.F. Mandelcorn of Montreal, W/C L.A. Costello, Principal Roman Catholic Chaplain and myself, together with S/L W. Cobb and P/O W. Tessier, DFC., Officers in charge, accompanied by a Trumpeter, R.C.A.F. Photographer, R.C.A.F. Public Relations Officer and representatives of the Press, was conducted to the scene of the burial by the Chief of St. Donat Police, Leo Bertrand, the Mayor of St. Donat, Richard Coutu, the members of St. Donat Council and a member of the Quebec Provincial Police.

A number of the next-of-kin who had driven in also attended. These included J.A. MacDonald and E.C. Hopkins, father and uncle of P/o Robert MacDonald, Gordon, William and Ira Beattie and James Arnold, three brothers and a brother-in-law of Corporal Harold Beattie, Mr. G. Sanderson and Mr. W. Slack, relatives of F/O Stephen Andrew Sanderson. AFM., Mr. and Mrs. G.O. Marr, parents of Corporal Ronald Douglas Marr, Mrs. G.R. Patterson, the widow of LAC Guy Ridgewood Patterson, Mr. and Mrs. MacNaughton, parents of Sgt. William G. MacNaughton, Mr. D.S. McLean and Mr. James Stewart MacNaughton, uncles of Sgt. MacNaughton, Mr. J.A. Poirier, father of F/L Joseph Alfred Poirier, together with Joseph's brother, P/O Cecil Polrier. As nearly as I can recollect the above folk comprise the representatives of the next-of-kin but as I am trusting my memory in this connection there may possibly have been some other relatives present. As well as the above, there were some hundred and fifty local inhabitants in attendance. Mr. and Mrs. MacNaughton, Mrs. Patterson and the other womenfolk remained below at the village.

The party left the hotel at St. Donat at 7:30 in the morning, drove back along the road for six miles, crossed a narrow arm of Lac Archambault and set out in a westerly direction along the trail that the advance party had broken in locating the crash and up the two hills that had to be climbed. Arriving at 11:00 o'clock at a tiny lake the party rested, had some sandwiches and then proceeded to the scene of the crash, arriving at 2:15 o'clock. Dictures of the settingfor the funeral service will be forwarded to you within a few days. These should give you a fairly good idea of where your loved one is buried.

A single red rose was then placed upright at the foot of each Cross and the Star of David by the next-of-kin present and by the Chief of Police and the Mayor who represented the next-of-kin who were not present.

The Chaplains took their places at the side of the Cairn, which had been erected by the advance party and on which a memorial bronze plaque will be permanently placed, and then proceeded to conduct the funeral services.

Captain Mandelcorn led off with the funeral rites for WO.l Jacob Silverstein, singing and reading the last rites of the Jewish faith for his laddie.

He was followed by W/C Costello, who was assisted by four priests who were vacationing at St. Donat. The full Roman Catholic Libera was chanted and read by these representatives of the Roman Catholic Church for F/L Poirier, F/O Sanderson and LAC. Joseph Veilleux. Upon the conclusion of the Roman Catholic Libera the last high offices of the Protestant Church were then conducted by the Principal Protestant Chaplain of the R.C.A.F. for the following:

The Protestant Service began with the reading of St. John 11:25-26; Romans 8:38-39; St. Matthew 5:14; St. John 14:1 and 2; Isaiah 40:11. These Scripture verses were followed by a reading of the names of the twenty Protestant boys who had paid the supreme sacrifice on this site.

The 23rd Psalm and the 121st Psalm were read, followed by the re-reading of some of the New Testament passages as above, together with Revelation 7:16 and 17.

Included in the funeral sermon were references to the fact that the lave given to God's children will never die, and that nothing can kill it; neither principalities nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come; nor the sword, nor the crash of aircraft, nothing can kill it; it will last over - Forever.

The group present was reminded that those gathered on this mountainside were joined in spirit by the loving next-of-kin from Halifax to the West Coast. The verses of 'O Valiant Hearts' were then read:

'O Valiant Hearts, who to your glory came Through dust of conflict and through battle flame Tranquil you lie, your knightly virtue proved, Your memory hallowed in the Land you loved.

O Risen Lord, O Shepherd of our Dead, Whose Cross has bought them and whose Staff has led, In glorious hope their proud and sorrowing land Commits her Children to Thy Gracious Hand."

Reference was made to a somewhat similar crash that had taken place in Britain during the war, while the Principal Chaplain was overseas. In this crash the Duke of Kent had been killed and Prime Minister Winston Churchill said:

....3

"There is something about death on active service which is different from ordinary death in the normal course of nature. It is accepted without question by the fighting men. Those they leave behind them are also conscious of a light of sacrifice and honor which plays around the grave or tomb of the warrior. They are, for the time being, uplifted. This adds to their fortitude but does not in any way lessen their pain. Nothing can fill the awful gap; nothing can assuage or comfort the loneliness and deprivation. Only faith in a life after death, in a brighter world, where dear ones will meet again - only that and the measured tramp of time can give consolation."

There followed a mention of the hope of immortality which is ours, founded on the words of our common Lord and Master; reference being made to the New Testament passages above mentioned.

Passages were then quoted from the address given by Abraham Lincoln at Gettysburg:

"We have come to dedicate a portion of this mountain as a final resting-place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live."

"The brave men who died here have consecrated it far above our power to add or detract."

"It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us, that from these honored dead we take increasing devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion; that we here highly resolve that those dead shall not have died in vain; that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom; and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth."

The Committal took the form of the placing of twenty maple leaves, which had been picked from the trees of Canada's Capital City, on the grave, one by one, with these words:

For as much as it has pleased Almighty God to take unto Himself the souls of our comrades departed, we therefore now commit their earthly remains to this grave - a maple leaf from the Capital City of our beloved nation for each one, the symbol which marked them as Canadians wherever they sojourned in war - the emblem of the land they loved and for which they died. A gallant group of young Canadian gentlemen they were.

"They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old; Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn, At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them."

The Committal Service was followed by the Prayer of Thanksgiving for the hope which is in Christ Jesus, and for the willingness with which our young men offered themselves and laid down their lives for the country which gave them birth.

Then came the prayer for the loved ones at home, the Lord's Prayer and the Benediction. After a brief pause, the Last Post was sounded by the R.C.A.F. Trumpeter. The Service was brought to a close by the

sounding of the Reveille and the saluting of each of the twentythree Crosses, the one Star of David and the Cairn by the three Chaplains and the Officers present.

Two wreaths were then placed at the foot of the Cairn as a token of loving remembrance.

We realize most intimately that the belated discovery of the wrecked aircraft has broken open again the wounds of your sorrow and loneliness and all of us in the Royal Camadian Air Force join with you in your grief.

or There, we are still in the Father's Hand and can look forward to that day when we shall know one another and love one another with a knowledge and love that are sternal in Christ Jesus our Lord.

In the meantime, it is our prayer that the Heavenly Father who gave His only and well beloved Son in sacrifice, even unto death, may grant you a peace that passeth all understanding and strength for the days ahead.

Dear Mr. Lamont:

It is my painful duty to confirm the information that was conveyed in the three telegrams I recently despatched to you, advising of the locating of the wreckage of the Liberator aircraft on which your son was proceeding from Gander to Dorval October 20th, 1943. I sincerely regret that at this time it is not possible to convey to you many more details than were contained in the telegrams, for the search party that had experienced great difficulty in reaching the site of the crash identified the wreckage as that of the Liberator and determined that it was not possible to make recovery or identify any of the occupants and then returned to the village of St. Donat, Quebec, with their initial report which was conveyed to you in my telegram of June 25th.

The weeckage was sighted by a Pilot who was engaged on the search for a missing aircraft that had proceeded over that area the day before and had failed to arrive at its destination. He observed a glint of sunshine on a metal object and on further investigation was able to determine that it was that remained of an aircraft but could not identify it. He conveyed the location to Headquarters and a search party was despatched immediately, but owing to the mountainous region, dense undergrowth and heavy timber the search party was not able to locate the site. An aircraft was then despatched to guide the search party from the air and difficulties encountered were so great that the site could not be observed until within fifteen feet of it. In addition, air activities were hampered by weather conditions, The exact location is described as forty-six degrees sixteen minutes North, seventy-four degrees eighteen minutes West, on west side of twenty-five hundred foot mountain. It is approximately six miles from the village of St. Donat, Quebec.

The search party has again proceeded and is at present at the scene of the crash where they will clear the area as well as possible and erect a cairn. Crosses are being made and will be taken to the scene of the crash for erection. These will be individual Crosses with the name, rank and date of death inscribed thereon. The difficulty of transporting flowers has been carefully considered, but twenty-four roses will be taken to the site which will represent one for each of the occupants of the aircraft. The Memorial' Burial Service will be held at the site of the crash on Wednesday, July 3rd, 1946, at 2:30 P.M. Eastern Daylight Time, weather permitting, the area being quite liable to be entirely covered by cloud if it is not a clear day. Wing Commander R.M. Frayne, Principal R.C.A.F. Protestant Chaplain and Wing Commander L.A. Costello, Principal R.C.A.F. Roman Catholic Chaplain, will proceed to the site and will officiate at the service. A trumpeter will also be present. Official R.C.A.F. photographers will secure photographs which will be conveyed to you and complete reports of the service will also be sent to you by the respective Chaplains. During the service a Union Jack will be draped over the cairn. A flag-pole will be erected if it is possible, behind the cairn. A permanent brass plaque will be placed on the cairn at a later dates it is not possible to have such a plaque manufactured and ready for the service.

The officer in charge of the search party states that it is beyond all doubt death was instantaneous to all occupants of the aircraft. He also states that the site is quite inaccessible and should only be undertaken by an experienced woodsman. Considerable difficulty will be encountered in getting the officiating party for the memorial service to the site.

I realize that the anxiety and heartaches you have had to endure these many months will not be lessened by anything conveyed in this letter, but it is my sincere hope that you may derive some measure of comfort from the knowledge that these gallant boys did not suffer, for death is merciful to the men who fly in the air.

May I express to you and the members of your family my deepest sympathy.




