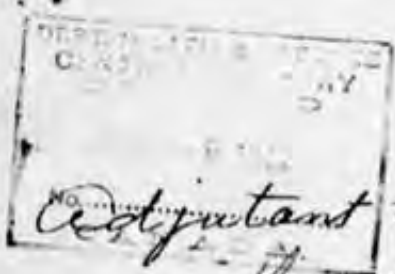

Sir:- I have the honor to communicate with you re medal of Trooper Kingsley (lately deceased) of the 1st C.M.P. afterwards the R. C. D.

I advised Trooper Kingsley's relatives in Brooklyn N.Y. that his medal was at Ottawa unclaimed according to list sent out some months ago and to communicate with you about it.

They have done so but state that they have no reply.

I was not present at the time of his death but saw him a few days before and know that he died at Koonstaddt Orange River Colony in the month of May 1900
