I have received reliable information from Ottawa, that my husband Stanley Albert Wood, enlisted in the RCAF, Saskatoon as a single man, when in reality his status is married, with four children. Douglas age 15 - Betty and Gwen age 14 - Phyllis age 13.

I obtained a separation in 1937, but in 1938 he was discharged from his job, which left us destitute and freed him from all obligatory alimony. I managed to obtain City Relief and in that way provide for his children. However, now that he is again in a position to support us I feel that he should do so.

I do not wish to cause any trouble or jeopardise his position in the army, because of misrepresentation of facts, but feel that for the sake of his children this situation should be corrected. Also in case of injury or death I would like to be notified, which would not be likely under existing conditions.

I am enclosing my Marriage Certificate and Separation Agreement as proof of identity, and would feel very grateful if you would give this matter your consideration and advise me how to obtain the usual allowance.

apart from the said husband as if she were a femme sole, and
shall henceforth be free from the control and authority of the

such manner as she shall think fit and shall work at any employ-
ment or carry on any business as she shall think fit and proper.

4. AND the said husband further covenants with the said
wife that he, the said husband, will not at any time hereafter
require her, the said wife, to live with him, or will not in-

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stitute any legal proceedings or take any other steps whatsoever to compel her to live with him, and will not molest or interfere with her in any way whatsoever.

5. AND in further consideration of the premises and of the covenants herein contained said husband hereby covenants with said wife that he will pay to her in good and lawful money of Canada at the office of her solicitors, Stevenson, McLorg & Bence, at Saskatoon, in the Province of Saskatchewan, the following sums, namely:-

6. AND in further consideration of the premises and of the covenants of the said wife herein contained, said husband hereby conveys and grants to said wife all his, the said husband's right, title, interest, claim and demand of, in and to all the household goods, furniture and effects heretofore used by the parties hereto at their home in Saskatoon aforesaid at any time, except for the following articles which are hereby acknowledged between the parties hereto to belong to said husband and which are to be taken possession of by said husband forthwith, namely:

- All smoking stands.
- All personal clothing.
- Jewelery and trinkets of said husband.
- 1/3 of the ordinary table dishes.

- That certain bed now being used by said husband, together with suitable bedding for same.
- 1 Chesterfield chair.
- All mechanical tools.
- 1 Small home-made bookcase.
- 1/3 of various kitchen utensils.

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7. AND in further consideration of the premises and the covenants of the said wife herein contained, the said husband hereby acknowledges that he is personally liable for all debts incurred by the parties hereto incidental to their housekeeping and married life, including doctors and hospital bills, (except any debts for monies borrowed by said wife from her mother or other relatives) and said husband agrees to indemnify and save harmless the said wife from all liability, if any, which the said wife may presently have relative to any of such accounts so acknowledged and assumed by said husband, and among the said accounts so assumed is all balance owing for rent of the premises in which the parties hereto have been residing, namely, 505 Avenue E South, in said City of Saskatoon, and the amount owing to or through Bailiff Calder for a certain rent seizure on the furniture made by said Bailiff, and in that connection said husband agrees to furnish said wife with a definite release from said Bailiff and his principal, insofar as said seizure covers the furniture not so taken by said husband.

Having lived in Peace & Harmony from 1922 until 1937 with Alice Wood as man & wife, though not without having trouble at odd times with Mrs Christie (mother in law) who said to me at the time of the marriage that she would break it up at a later date. At this time ^{Summer 1937} my wife came home from a rest at her relatives farm at North Battleford & the next A.M. I found a note on the table saying a lawyer, Mr Stevenson wished to see me at his office. On going to see him I was told Alice wanted a separation, upon investigation by me I found all the trouble was coming from Mrs Christie, which at that time Alice did not deny. As I had accidentally found a letter to her mother reporting all she had done & wanting to know what to do next. On asking her about this letter she said she & her mother had decided that her & the children would be better off living with her mother. So I told her to expect no support from me if she took the children away. Then I was told no support was wanted as her mother was financially able & willing to look after the family & I was from that time on to consider myself a stranger & a single man. A few days later Mrs Christie came to Saskatoon to assume charge of the house & family, & she also assured me she was able to look after the children. As Alice was suffering from a nervous disorder I consulted the family doctor & on his advice I took enough furniture to furnish a single room & left them the rest on the understanding they were to look after it as well as the family. About 2 weeks later I saw some of my furniture in a second hand store window & on going inside I was told he had purchased the whole house hold & that Alice & the children had moved in with Mrs Christie to Somerset Terrace which I found to be true. A few days later on meeting my son Douglas on the street he assured me they were quite comfortable as his grandmother had a nice suite all furnished for them to live together. In regards to a letter from Mr Stevenson dated April 17/40-HQ-1022-W-316-F.D. 26 several of his statements are false, whether deliberate or not I cannot say.

(Para) B. - is false as the furniture was sold.

(Para) C. is false as she at once took up residence with her mother at Somerset Terrace.

(Para) D. also false as I made repeated attempts to see the children & also sent notes asking them to come & see me but was always ignored. Also at that time I left the City but was forced by illness to come back.

(Para) E. I tried without success to see her & the children before enlisting but was again refused & word was sent to me that under no conditions was I wanted around her place & that she would not talk to me at any time or place.

(Para) H. Alice & her mother asserted to me several times their ability & willingness to look after the family with out any help from me. If on top of this they are in receipt of City relief they are indeed fortunate. I would like to know how Mr Stevenson is so very emphatic in his statements, as he was at no time in any position to know what I was doing or if I did or did not say good bye to my children. But I have known him to tell a false hood before. I firmly believe it is a plan to get some easy money from a man only trying to serve his King & Country in this time of need. & I submit this Partial statement in reply to their charges insofar ^{neither} the Government nor myself are responsible for any allowance or pay.

DO SOLEMNLY DECLARE: Until about July, 1937, I was living with my wife and family of four children at 424 Ave. E. South, Saskatoon, Sask., although my wife was absent from home on account of illness, or visiting her mother and brother for long periods of time during our married life. At that time I was employed as salesman with Purity Dairy, Saskatoon. One day during that month I found a note in the house signed by my wife requesting to see Mr. Stevenson, a lawyer. I did so and he informed me that my wife wanted a separation on the grounds that she thought I was interested in other women. Such was not the case, and I firmly believe my wife's actions were due to a nervous disorder, as explained to me by Dr. Louis Schullman, Saskatoon, who had been attending her for some years. As I was convinced from the doctor's diagnosis that such condition would likely continue, I agreed to sign a separation agreement, same being dated 10th September, 1937.

I made the payment as called for in the agreement for a matter of months until I lost my job in the Spring of 1938, on account of illness. Thereafter I drew sick single relief from the Town of Saskatoon. At odd times I did repair jobs on cars. I joined the R.C.A.F. 14th October, 1939, at Saskatoon.

At no time did my wife honor the terms of the separation agreement by permitting me access to the children notwithstanding several requests from me to her, excepting on one occasion, when I requested her solicitor to send the children to see me. On a few occasions my son, now aged 16, came to see me without the knowledge of his mother.

I left Saskatoon for Manning Pool, Toronto, 18th October, 1939, thence to St. Thomas, 10th November, 1939, then to North Sydney, N.S., arriving at the latter place 1st May, 1940.

Immediately prior to my enlistment in the R.C.A.F., at my request, Mr. Vivian Cheska, of Silex Cafe, Saskatoon, requested my wife to see me. This she refused to do.

Prior to the date of the separation agreement, my wife and also her mother had informed me on several occasions that she, my mother-in-law, was quite able financially to provide for my said wife and children with any help from me.

Under these circumstances, and particularly in view of the breach of the agreement by my wife, I do not feel obligated to provide for her support.

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing it to be true and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath and by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act.

With reference to your signal P823 of the 21st/3/40 and letter 1022-W-316 of 25/1/40 both of which were passed to this H. Q. for necessary action on 25/3/40 the following information concerning the above named airman is forwarded as requested.

AC2 Wood relates that he has not made an allowance to his wife since the separation agreement was signed, because she immediately failed to comply with the terms of the agreement.

For example, she sold all the furniture and effects of his home and took up residence with the children at the home of her parents. She has consistently refused him access to the children, much against the wishes of the children. He made no effort to conceal his enlistment, in fact, he requested her permission that he should be allowed to visit her and the children when he enlisted, and in addition, his name appeared in the local press amongst those in the district who joined the R.C.A.F.

He was not discharged from his job during 1938, but was in ill health and partly employed during 1939, during which period he earned between \$25 and \$30 a month. This temporary incapacity resulted in the removal of all his teeth, from which time he has enjoyed excellent health.

He is not prepared to support his wife in any way, because she and her parents have reiterated their intentions and capabilities of looking after the children without his financial and moral support.

He would not however, allow his children to be in need of the amenities of life within his capacity to supply, and if they needed help at any time they know he would not fail them.

It will be observed by the above precis that this airman's obligations under the separation agreement became void owing to the wife's failure to live up to covenant 9 (B) of the agreement.

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Proviso (iii) of article 101 F.R.&I. on Active Service indicates that an award of Dependents' Allowance to a wife separated from her husband by reason of a separation agreement is permissive not mandatory, and that in the case of this airman who receives \$1.95 a day, fifteen days assignment of pay covers the \$25 payable under the agreement.

In view of the conditions of section 145 of the Air Force Act, it is submitted that in the absence of a judicial order pay cannot be deducted from the pay of this airman, and in these circumstances and the fact that marriage allowance from public sources is not involved it would appear that no official action can be taken on Mrs. Woods' claim to \$25 a month.

1. This Airman enlisted 17.10.39 as a single man and was in receipt of P.A.A.F. Rates of pay until 1.3.41, when he elected Active Service Rates.

2. It was subsequently discovered that he was married, had four children, and was responsible for their maintenance by a separation agreement drawn up on September 10, 1937, which called for payment of \$25.00 every half month. These payments were carried on until August 1938, when Wood lost his job and was forced to accept City relief. By the same token Mrs. Woods and the four children were destitute and also had to go on City relief.

3. This condition prevailed until Wood enlisted 17.10.39, and after considerable investigation the Dependents' Allowance Board found him to be responsible for his wife's and children's maintenance and authorized a Dependents' Allowance award of \$54.00 monthly from date of enlistment. At the same time a compulsory assignment of \$20.00 was put into effect from September 1940. At the end of July 1940, a Dependent's Allowance cheque in the amount of \$513.00 was issued covering Dependents' Allowance for the period 17.10.39 to 31.7.40, and payments of \$54.00 Dependent's Allowance have been made monthly since that date.

4. No MFM 16 was submitted on this case, and due to some undetermined reason it was not discovered until recently that payments of Dependent's Allowance were not in order as the Airman was in receipt of P.A.A.F. rates of pay from 17.10.39 to 28.2.41. As a result, an over-payment of \$891.00 has been created covering the above-noted period.

5. Due to the circumstances, it is the opinion of the Dependents' Allowance Board and this office that Wood be made responsible, and in view of this we would suggest that he be placed on Active Service Rates from date of enlistment, 17.10.39, until 28.2.41. By so doing Dependents' Allowance payments would be authorized, automatically wiping out the over-payment. On the adjustment to Active Service Rates for this period the net debit to be charged to the Paylist account would amount to \$228.15.

6. We would request therefore, that an order be promulgated showing the election to Active Service Rates effective 17.10.39, and that Wood's Paylist account be debited the amount of \$228.15 to adjust the account in full.

7. Your remarks in this connection would be appreciated by this office.
