Health of Mrs. Goldberg: Mrs. G. is a tall, stately-looking woman of fifty-seven years of age. She is pale appearing, nervous and emotionally upset. Although first impression indicated a quiet and reserved woman, there were times when Mrs. G. seemed to forget herself and would talk ceaselessly without interruption, her ideas being incoherent and distracting.

Mrs. G. is suffering from a severe case of high blood pressure. Her complaints are headaches, insomnia, dizziness and weak spells. Last December she lost the sight of her right eye, caused by a formation of a blood clot in this region. Dr. Alexander attended her at this time. His medical report will be forwarded to your office upon receipt.

It is believed by the family that the loss of her late son, Louis, while serving with the R.C.A.F. and the transfer of soldier, Harry, to an overseas posting, which occurred simultaneously, had its effect in bringing about her present condition. Dr. M. Notkin has been caring for Mrs. G. since 1941 and his medical report is enclosed.

Although Mrs. G. has been advised by her doctor to avoid excitement of any kind, to rest and relax, she finds little or no relief from her ailments by doing so. Although she takes sedatives to induce sleep, they are not successful, and she remains awake the greater part of the night. Mrs. G. worries constantly about her son, Harry, and has all sorts of fears and anxiety that she will not see him again. It can be safely said that Mrs. G. is somewhat neurotic.

There is no need for Mrs. G. to have any physical attention such as nursing care, as she is well able to care for her own needs.

Family: Mrs. G. receives all possible assistance from her children who appear most devoted to their mother, and anxious to do all they can to ease her suffering. There appear to be close ties between the siblings and it was stated that the loss of their brother, Louis, has been felt keenly by them all.

Mrs. G's husband died in 1938 at the age of fifty-two, from a cancer. His passing was sudden and caused a severe shock to the whole family. Children are as follows:

1. Sarah Horovitch, 5162 Durocher Ave., thirty-four years of age. She lives upstairs of Mrs. G. Is married and has two small children. Mrs. Horovitch has just returned from the Jewish General Hospital after two months confinement. After the birth of her child, she developed phlebitis and was critically ill during this period. She is now at home and will be bed-ridden for some time to come. A trained nurse is attending her and is caring for the children. It may be said that the illness of this daughter has further aggravated the nervous condition of Mrs. G.

2. Maime Stein - 5172 Isabella Road, thirty-two years of age. She is married and has two children. She lives quite a distance away from her mother's home yet she endeavours to be of as much assistance as possible.

3. Louis Goldberg. Deceased. Was killed in 1941 while on duty with the R.C.A.F., at the age of twenty-seven.

4. Max Goldberg, St. Urbain St., twenty-seven years of age. He is married and has one child. He lives with his in-laws. This son has recently been discharged from the army. He has not yet found regular employment.

5. Harry Goldberg, soldier overseas. He is twenty-five years of age, Enlisted in 1940 and has been overseas since 1941. He was wounded in France during July 1944 and is at present convalescing in a hospital in England. This occurrence is also a source of worry to Mrs. G.

6. Rubin Goldberg. He is twenty-two and in the army. He is stationed at Longueuil, Quebec and has permission to sleep at home. He does not get any subsistence allowance. Rubin is not of much help to his mother as he is away from home from the early morning until late at night. He has been attending school classes at Sir George Williams College in his spare evenings as he plans studying to be an engineer.

Mrs. G's relatives are living in Europe. She has not heard from them since the outbreak of war.

Financial circumstances: Mrs. G. lives in a six-roomed tastily furnished downstairs flat which is owned by dependent. The flat appears clean, well-kept and exceedingly comfortable. Mrs. G. is able to do the heavy housework. As was previously stated, the upstairs flat is rented to her daughter, Mrs. Horovitch, \$35.00 monthly rental is obtained. Other sources of income are - \$51.00 D.A. and A.P. from Harry, \$20.00 A.P. from Rubin, \$20 monthly from a roomer. The yearly taxes on Mrs. G.'s property are about 155.00. There is a heavy mortgage on her house, payments of which have been withheld the last few years.

Mrs. G. was the sole beneficiary of a \$3000 life insurance policy which she became entitled to after the death of her late son. Dependent uses this money to live on as most of the A.P. she receives from her two soldier sons is used for their own benefit. Other children assist financially in small ways.

Recommendation: The particular problems in this case are not of a financial nature but stem rather from a combination of psychological factors, which have produced in Mrs. G. a state of nervous anxiety. While we understand that the causes of this condition are deep and involved, we feel nevertheless that the presence of Cpl. G. at home would no doubt have a beneficial effect on his mother's mental health.

However, since this family was unable to indicate any specific service the soldier could render at home aside from being a source of comfort to his ailing mother, we do not feel we can recommend this transfer as being urgently required except on moral grounds.

MEDICAL CERTIFICATE

September 26, 1944.

TO WHOME IT MAY CONCERN:

This patient stated that on January 3rd, 1944 she suddenly lost the vision in her right eye.

She first consulted me on January 11th some eight days later when I found a thrombosis of the right central artery to be present. I have seen her on several occasions since then, my last examination being on July 31, 1944, when I found the pupil to be fixed and no vision present. The left eye, however, was normal in every respect with the exception of some early sclerotic changes in the retinal vessels.

In my opinion the right eye is blind permanently with no further treatment indicated.

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MEDICAL CERTIFICATE

September 19, 1944.

Mrs. Goldberg was seen in 1939 for mild hypertension with cardiac hypertrophy. In February 1944 the blood pressure rose to 200/115 and by June 1944 was 240/120.

In 1943 she lost sight of the right eye due to retinal hemorrhage.

She was last seen by me on August 1st, 1944. The blood pressure was 225/130.

She is quite nervous and irritable, worrying no doubt about her own condition and also anxious about her son overseas.

The prognosis is not definitely predictable but cerebral hemorrhage may occur especially through excitement or shock. There is very little likelihood of temporary improvement and definitely no possibility of permanent improvement of her hypertension.

DECLARATION AND PETITION

WE, the undersigned, SARAH GOLDBERG HOROVITCH and MAMIE GOLDBERG STEIN, housewives, both of the City and District of Montreal, hereby declare and respectfully petition you as follows:

1. THAT we respectfully solicit your consideration and approval of the present application for special leave for our abovementioned brother on compassionate grounds for the following reasons:
2. THAT our brother, Cpl. Harry Goldberg, joined the Duke of York Royal Canadian Hussars in Montreal, in July 1940, and went overseas on or about August 1941.
3. THAT Cpl. Harry Goldberg has been continuously in active service since the aforesaid date, that is, for a period of more than four years.
4. THAT, in addition, Cpl. Goldberg's younger brother, Cpl. Ruby Goldberg is now serving with the Canadian Army in Canada.
5. THAT, moreover, prior to July 1941 Cpl. Goldberg's older brother, Sgt. Plt. Louis Goldberg, served as a pilot with the R.C.A.F. and went overseas on or about January 1941.
6. THAT, on or about July 1941, our brother, Sgt. Plt. Louis Goldberg, was accidentally killed overseas while in the course of air operations.
7. THAT the shock of the aforesaid loss has proved a most serious blow to the health of our mother, Mrs. Bertha Goldberg, now residing at 5164 Durocher Avenue, in the City of Outremont, District of Montreal.

8. THAT, as a matter of fact, immediately after the aforesaid accident to and the loss of our late brother, Sgt. Plt. Louis Goldberg, our mother, who is now approximately 60 years of age, was obliged to reside with one of the present applicants, De. Sarah Goldberg Horovitch, for a period of at least 18 months, in order that she be given proper attention and nursing, with a view to restoring her health in some measure.

9. THAT, notwithstanding the best of care given to our mother under these circumstances and, notwithstanding special medical attention obtained for her, our mother continues to suffer serious mental depressions and relapses in health due chiefly to her nervousness and worries concerning our above-mentioned brother now overseas.

10. THAT, in addition, the Doctors attending our mother have established that she is suffering from a serious condition of hyper-tension (high blood pressure) which has so seriously affected her health that recently she has lost the complete vision of her right eye, subsequent cause of a blood clot formed by the condition previously mentioned.

11. THAT the aforesaid loss of vision occurred approximately six months ago and that since the said date the condition of our mother's health has continually become worse.

12. THAT, because of the aforesaid poor condition of health, our mother has become increasingly nervous, worrisome, and difficult to pacify, particularly on the subject of our brother now on active service (overseas).

13. THAT, as a matter of fact, her continuous fear is that she will, in the very near future, lose the sight of both her eyes without being able to see her son, Cpl. Harry Goldberg, even if he should return safely to Canada at some later date.

14. THAT the aforesaid conditions and circumstances have become a great strain on the welfare of our entire family.

15. THAT, if the present condition is permitted to continue, we are fearful that our mother's condition will become increasingly worse .

16. THAT the aggravation of her present poor physical and mental state may cause us to suffer another serious loss in the family here.(our mother).

17. THAT it is our firm conviction that if a leave of absence were granted to our brother, Cpl. Harry Goldberg, to return to Canada for the purpose of a short visit without our mother and family that the life and health of our mother will be safe-guarded and improved.

18. THAT the medical reports of Dr. M. Notkin and Dr. B. Alexander concerning the health and eye sight of our mother have already been forwarded to the Department


