I deeply regret to inform you that your son, Lieutenant Mitchell Sterlin, gave his life in the Service of his Country in the Mediterranean Theatre of War on the 19th day of December 1943.

In addition to the administration of those Service assets, the Administrator of Estates is authorized to withdraw into Government account any funds (within a defined amount) on deposit to the deceased's credit in Banks, Post Offices or other financial institutions in Canada and Overseas, without expense or trouble to the person(s) legally entitled to the estate, and to distribute such funds at the same time as any balance of pay is distributed. Also, War Savings Certificates and Victory Loan Bonds owned by the deceased may be redeemed and similarly distributed, or transmitted into the name(s) of the person(s) legally entitled. Such Certificates and Bonds should not be forwarded to the Administrator of Estates until they are requested.

If there are other assets which necessitate an application for Probate or Letters of Administration, the Administrator of Estates may transfer and hand over the Service assets to the executor or administrator appointed by the Court so that all the estate, Service and otherwise, may be dealt with as a whole.

The information given by you and 3 of this form is therefore of importance in determining whether or not the deceased's assets are such that they may be administered by the Administrator of Estates to the person(s) legally entitled, that is, without the need for Probate or Administration.

Dear Miss Sterlin:-

With reference to your letter of January 22nd., addressed to the War Graves Commission, I am to inform you that according to information received from the Overseas Military Authorities, the body of Lieutenant Sterlin was buried on 23rd December 1943 in a temporary grave at a point approximately four miles North-West of San Vito Chietino, Italy, in the immediate vicinity in which his death occurred. San Vito is located on the Adriatic Coast some fourteen miles South-East of Pescara. The grave will have been temporarily marked with a wooden marker for identification purposes and in due course the body will be carefully exhumed and removed to a recognized military burial ground when the concentration of graves in the area takes place.

With reference to the granting of an award, there is not any record of your brother having been awarded the Military Cross, but he was mentioned in Despatches, authority Canada Gazette No. 1 dated 6th January 1945, under the following heading:-
